

Dominicans Tour U.S. Dairy Plants

Two Texas A&M dairy science students from the Dominican Republic will visit five dairy plants in three states during late August and early September.

They are Juan Ernesto Villar and Ramon G. Bejaran, both juniors majoring in dairy manufacturing.

Purpose of their trips is to study organization and opera-

tions of major dairy manufacturing plants.

They will tour the Dean Milk Company and the Kyana Milk Producers in Louisville, Ky., Aug. 26-28 and Aug. 29-30; the Armour Creamery in Springfield, Ky., Sept. 2-4; the Borden Company in Columbus, Ohio, Sept. 6-10; and the Borden Company in Woodstock, Ill, Sept. 11.

William E. Beach of the A&M

Office of International Programs said Villar and Bejaran are attending the university on scholarships sponsored by the U. S. Agency for International Development (AID).

Dr. Henry Randolph of the A&M Animal Science Department Dairy Section said Villar and Bejaran will prepare a class report on the trip.

He said the plants to be visited "are some of the very best operations in the United States." The Dean plant is fully auto-

mated and processes a complete line of fluid milk and cultured products.

The Kyana plant is a producer cooperative operation processing dry milk powder and butter, and the Armour plant is typical of those that manufacture milk products (cheese, powder, condensed milk and butter).

Borden has two large plants in Columbus, Randolph added. One is a diversified milk and related products plant, and the other is fully automated for making ice

cream and other frozen desserts. He said Borden's plant in Woodstock is the largest milk processing operation in the world. The students will observe many of the latest developments in equipment and processing technology.

Randolph said the trip will be a valuable supplement to the academic training of Villar and Bejaran and should provide many useful ideas when they join the Dominican Republic Department of Agriculture after graduation.

Graduation Plans Set For Driver Training Program

Graduation ceremonies for 96 high school teachers and assistants participating in a driver education program at Texas A&M are set for 7:30 p. m. Friday in the Memorial Student Center.

Dr. Leslie Hawkins, Texas A&M industrial education professor and director of the five-week program, said the featured speaker will be Harian Ford of Austin, assistant

commissioner of education, Texas Education Agency.

Hawkins noted participants in the course include 42 certificated supervising teachers and 54 persons who enrolled to qualify as teaching assistants.

The teaching assistants began the course July 15 and were joined by the supervising teachers July 29.
