4-H's To Study Engines

Texas 4-H members have a new project to work on this year.

It is the Petroleum Power program, says Henry O'Neal, Extension agricultural engineer. The program includes projects on both small engines and tractors.

The Small Engines project is divided into three units, beginning with small engine power. The next two units are two-stroke cycle engines and four-stroke cycle engines. The 4-H member will learn how to operate and service small engines, care for them and make necessary minor adjustments. His experience with two-cycle and four-cycle engines will go well beyond the power lawn mower.

He also will be able to use his mechanical skills on boat motors, chain saws, pump engines, sprayers, generators for portable welders and other equipment, as well as cars and tractors.
