

# Maxwell Prefers Safety Over End Spot

There may be a lot of glamour attached to the split end position in football but Texas A&M's Tommy Maxwell prefers to play safety on defense.

Maxwell, one of the very few two-way players in this day of platoon football, says he gets a

bigger thrill out of intercepting an opponent's pass than he does in catching a touchdown pass on offense.

"I don't know exactly how to explain it but I feel more a part of the team at safety. You know, at split end you're out there by yourself. It gets kinda lonesome, sometimes."

Maxwell, at 6-2 and 191, has 9.7 track speed for the 100 and he's an ideal prospect for the professional scouts. He went out for track last spring, not primarily to set the SWC track records on fire, but more to learn how to run.

Track coaches Charlie Thomas and Ted Nelson say that Maxwell improved tremendously. "He learned how to run relaxed, and keep control of his body," Thomas explains. "He was too tight before, getting knots in his legs."

Coach Gene Stallings says that Maxwell "probably next to Edd Hargett, made more 'big plays' for A&M than anyone last year."

Statistics reveal that he caught 18 passes, 2 for touchdowns and intercepted 3 passes and recovered 1 fumble. And that doesn't include the Cotton Bowl where he made an interception and caught a TD pass.

Maxwell, a Houston Jones product, made the transition from split end to safety at his own suggestion following A&M's fourth straight loss last season. It might be noted that the Aggies have not lost a game since Maxwell started playing safety.

Perhaps it was in the Rice game last year that Maxwell made his biggest contributions to Aggie success. Late in the third period, with A&M holding a meager 6-3 lead, Rice was on the move with a second-and-five at midfield. Robby Shelton passed and Maxwell made a diving interception in front of the intended receiver at A&M's 40. From there the Aggies drove to a TD and the payoff was a seven-yard Hargett pass to—Maxwell, who made

a leaping catch in the end zone. A&M went on to win, 18-3.

Though he'd never played the position until game number 5, Maxwell did so well at safety that he was named to the all-SWC team at that position.

## Season Grid Ticket Sales Top 10,000

Texas A&M's 1967 football success is reflected in the great pre-season ticket sale in the school's storied history.

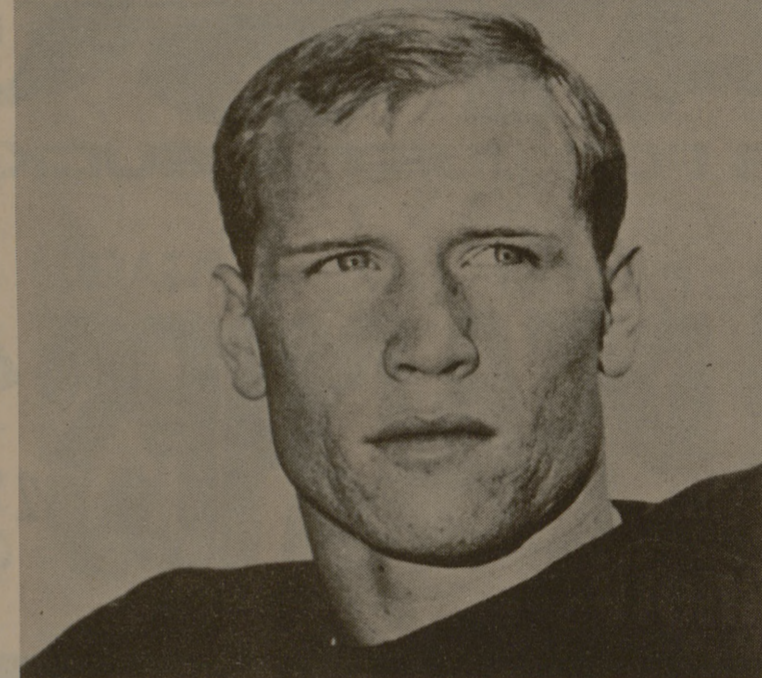
More than 10,000 books of season tickets have been sold for the four home games with Texas Tech, TCU, Arkansas and Rice. The previous high was 5,800 books last year and 5,600 books in 1956.

In addition, single-game sales here range from 1,800 for the TCU game to 3,600 for Arkansas. There have been 2,500 single-game Rice tickets purchased and 2,300 for the Tech game.

Between 12 and 13,000 student and dates tickets are expected to go when the Aggies hit campus and then tickets are being sold in Lubbock, Fort Worth, Fayetteville and Houston. It would appear that a minimum of 30,000 fans are nearly assured for each game already. And, if the Aggies have a hot hand early in the season, Kyle Field's 48,000 capacity could be filled for any or all of the four home games.

Two road games—LSU and Texas—already are sellouts.

Single game and season tickets are still available for fans desiring to make orders. The season tickets for four home games are \$20.00 (\$5 per ticket). Single game tickets are \$6 for Tulane and Florida State and \$5 for the others.
