Texas A&M's Edd Hargett is on the verge of taking over Southwest Conference passing records in career attempts, completions, net yardage and touch-

The Marietta, Tex., senior who played at Linden-Kildare High, needs to complete a nine-yard pass against Arkansas next Saturday to vault into the all-time SWC lead for passing yardage. He still is 29 completions away from taking over that phase of the records but if he attempts as many as eight passes he will become the throwing-est passer in the league's history. 


