"To relieve the tensions built up by studying, we have also

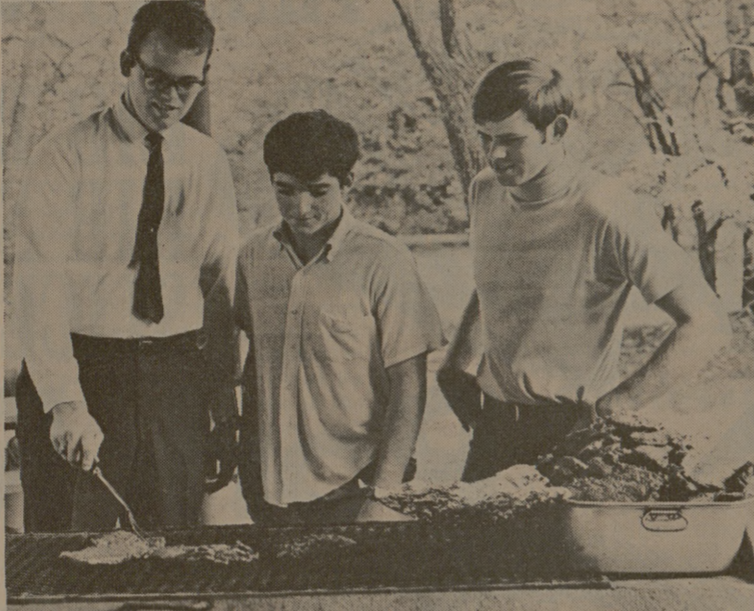
started a number of informal discussions on Monday nights," said Scott.

1. Make an appointment with your Academic Advisor. (Use the University Directory for phone number).
2. Secure complete information sheet showing courses and approval of your Academic Advisor. (This must be done before you can proceed).
3. Present information sheet and ID card to the Dean's Office. Check and/or complete information card in packet.
4. Pick up the completed and approved assignment card (with yellow stripe).
5. Turn in all cards (including assignment card) to the Registration Headquarters, First Floor, Cushing Building (west entrance of old library).
