

# Biophysicist To Speak

A relatively new field in the reclaiming and reuse of polluted water, "Water Treatment by Electrophoresis," will be a discussion highlight of the 13th annual Conference on Water for Texas here November 25-26.

Research biophysicist Milan Bier of Tucson, Ariz., will present the lecture.

Bier, associated with the University of Arizona and Veterans Administration Hospital, reported forced-flow electrophoresis has been applied to the purification of polluted waters from "a wide

range of sources." He identified them as being comprised of river and pond water, floodwater, effluent of various treatment plants, and various industrial wastes.

Dr. Jack Runkles, acting director of A&M's Water Resources Institute and conference sponsor, pointed out "Bier has given particular attention to some problems specific for the arid Southwest" such as treatment of waters collected in catchment areas or impounded floodwaters.

"THE METHOD HAS BEEN

found to be singularly effective in improving the quality of the treated water by completely eliminating particulate matter, such as silt, algae and bacteria, as well as radically decreasing colloidal impurities," Bier reported.

Runkles noted that 'electrophoresis' is the migration of electrically charged colloidal particles in an electric field.

"It is well recognized as one of the most fruitful methods for the analysis and separation of complex biocolloidal systems," Bier added.

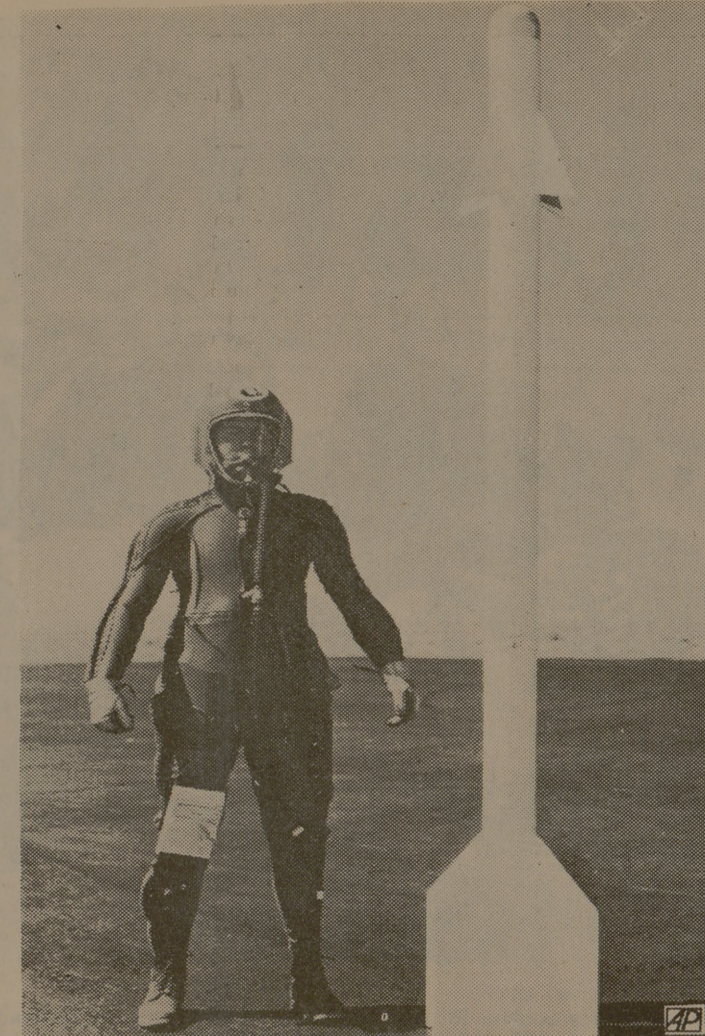

## New Dorm Lounges Almost Completed

Contractors are concentrating on having four of the six new dormitory lounges ready for use by Nov. 26.

Dean of Students James P. Hannigan said the plan is to have lounges connecting dorms 1 and 3, 5 and 7, 2 and 4, 6 and 8 ready for bonfire visitors.

"This is a hope and not a guarantee by any means," the dean said.

Hannigan indicated several construction items and bad weather have delayed completion of the lounges. Inside light fixtures are supposed to be here Monday for installation.

"Outside lights will be placed immediately," Hannigan noted, indicating pedestrian accidents in the unlighted areas are a problem.

Furniture will be stored in each lounge's TV room Nov. 19, from which it will be installed. Afterwards, cable-connected television sets and theater-type chairs will be placed.

"The contractors hope to complete all work, including that on lounges for dorms 9-11 and 10-12, before Christmas," Hannigan added.

## Library Revamps

Reclassification of the A&M library's basic collection under the Library of Congress system has been completed, announced Dr. James P. Dyke, director.

The new system was adopted and the changeover begun when the library moved into its new quarters last August.

"All journals on the first floor have been marked by the LC system," Dyke added. "All basic collection materials are indexed in the Reader's Guide."

The library director said patrons needing assistance with the new system should inquire at the basic service desk.

"We are gradually getting everything reorganized and reclassified," Dyke went on, "but it will take a good while yet to finish."
