Smoking vs. Health Of Kids Studied

Research is under way at Texas A&M to determine if the health of elementary school age children is affected by a tobacco-smoking environment.

Tests for the doctoral dissertation research of A. J. Luquette, graduate assistant in the Health and Physical Education Department, involved personnel, equipment and ideas of Health and PE, Industrial Engineering, Biology and Psychology Departments and the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M, E&M Instruments of Houston and the T e x a s State Department of Health's Air Pollution Division.

The interdisciplinary research enabled examination of heart rate and blood pressure of 150 children breathing air containing cigarette smoke.

"Preliminary indications are that a child's heart rate does seem to increase in the test conditions," Luquette remarked.

"Dr. Paul Cameron of Wayne State found in a statistical study that smokers' children are ill more frequently than non-smokers'," Luquette reviewed. "A Utah physician, C. D. Fullmer, likewise believes smoke-filled rooms at home, office or in public places may represent a health hazard for non-smokers."

The Texas A&M experiments, involving both children and adults, were conducted in the critically controlled chambers of the Industrial Engineering Department's Environmental Control Laboratory. The well-equipped facility allows precise measurements of temperature, humidity, sound, air flow and visual effects.

Luquette said all the experiments have been completed and detailed analysis is under way.

Sensing, recording and control equipment was supervised by Jim Hennigan, industrial engineering instructor, and Charles Brandt, graduate assistant.
