Two seniors are among 1,100 students designated by the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation as the best future college teachers on the continent.

They are designate Roderick D. Stonedale of Houston and Norman D. Gabitzsch of Brownsville who received honorable mention. Both students are physics majors.

The students, representing 349 colleges, were finalists in competition from which 11,704 candidates were nominated.

A list of the designates and honorable mention recipients has been sent to all graduate school deans in the U. S. and Canada with the recommendation that the graduate schools make fellowship awards to the students.

This year's selection represented the second year of the designation program which is supported by the Ford Foundation. Prior to 1968 the Woodrow Wilson Foundation, with Ford Foundation funds, annually made direct financial awards to 1,000 students to support their first year of graduate study.

Confab To Study Teaching Methods

Ways of making industrial arts education more compatible with modern day industry will be investigated Friday and Saturday in the annual Industrial Arts Teacher Conference.

More than 600 participants from throughout Texas and the Southwest will discuss new ideas, teaching techniques, teaching equipment and curriculum changes, according to Dr. Everett R. Glazener, Industrial Education Department head.

and state director of vocational technical education. The conference consultant will speak Friday on "Critical Issues and Challenges in Industrial Education."

Conference sessions will be conducted in the Memorial Student Center, where registration will be held Friday morning. Industrial exhibits by more than 40 firms will be near department offices and classrooms in the Mechanical Engineering Shops Building.

The two-day conference sponsored by the A&M department and Texas Industrial Arts Association will have group discussion on visual communications, the Industrial Arts Curriculum Project (IACP) in action, power mechanics innovations, new industrial drafting approaches and creativeness, among others.
