



SEATTLE (AP) _ Tex Winter, completing his first season as head basketball coach at the University of Washington, is considering an offer from Texas Technological College.

Winter, who came here from Kansas State after winning eight big Eight championships said Thursday he probably will give Texas Tech his answer Friday.

Coaching Texas Tech's basketball team now is Gene Gibson, whose Southwest Conference team

"There is a possibility Gibson will resign," Tech athletic director Polk F. Robinson told the Seattle Times when contacted by telephone. He said he had visited Winter with the permission of Washington's athletic director, Jim Owens.

"I don't feel I am in any position to make a switch after one year here," said Winter, 47, whose record this season is 11-10. He given Robinson an answer. "I am still considering.'

"Polk called me a couple of days ago. He was just feeling me out. I told him I would give it some thought. He is supposed to call me tomorrow.'

Winter's mother lives in Lubbock, where Texas Tech is located. The coach, however, attended Southern California.


