
Behind the great relief pitching of Larry McCombs the Aggies added to their margin with a run in the eighth and another in the ninth to make it 9-6.

Mills broke the tape with a 47.0 clocking to 47.1 for Morton. Last week Mills clipped Morton in College Station when both were timed in 47 flat.

Texas sprinter Tommy Colgin pulled up lame in the opening event to crush the Longhorns' chances in the short sprints. The upset Aggie victory was also aided by the fact that Houston swept the 1-2-3 places in both the mile and 3-mile runs to cut the 'Horns out of some more anticipated points.
