Ags Edge Past Missouri For Eighth Straight Win

A pair of freshmen, Stan Chick and Charles Kelley, teamed up to pitch the Aggie baseballers to a 2-0 victory over Missouri yesterday in Kyle Field.

The win was the eighth straight this season for Coach Tom Chandler's team without a defeat.

Chick, a lefthander from Dallas, got the win in his first college appearance ever. In seven innings, Chick shutout the

Tigers on three hits while striking out four and walking only one.

Kelley, a West Columbia product who has started three games thus far for the Aggies, pitched the final two innings to save the win.

The Aggies scored what turned out to be the winning run in the fifth. Pete Maida led off the inning for A&M with a double and scored two outs later when Chick hit a grounder to short that resulted in a two base error.

Three singles and a walk provided the Aggies with their insurance run in the sixth. Mike DeNiro started the rally with a single to right and advanced to second when Dave Elmendorf drew a free pass. Chris Sans then beat out a perfect bunt to fill the bases and DeNiro scored on a single to left by Eddie Vaughn. Missouri's Tom Lundgren got out of the inning without any farther damage by striking out the next three Aggies.

Kelley had to work his way out of a jam in the ninth. Danny Alberts led off the inning for the Tigers with a double. Del Blunk flew out to center and Steve Patchin grounded out pitcher to first. Paul Frisch then legged out a single to deep short

to put Missouri runners on first and third. Kelley bore down to get Butch Davis on strikes to end the game.

The Aggies threatened in the fourth on singles by Long and Sans but couldn't get the run across. Vaughn, Long and Sans each ended the game with two hits.

Missouri goes against the Aggies again today at 3 p.m. on Kyle Field.

Coach Chandler has selected Sonny Benefield, a recruit from the Aggie basketball squad, as his starter in the windup of the Missouri series.

The next Southwest Conference action for the Aggies is this weekend in Fort Worth against Texas Christian. A&M plays TCU in a Friday doubleheader and a Saturday single game.

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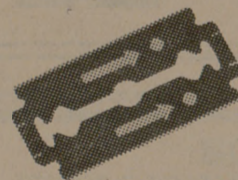
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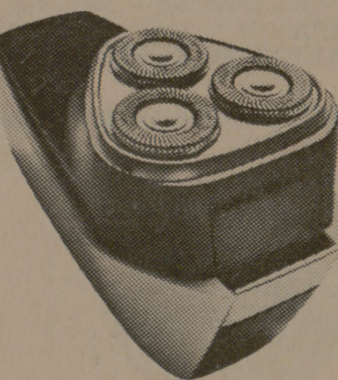
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
