

Ace quartermiler Curtis Mills will move back to his specialty this week after running a 21.0 in the 220 at Lubbock last week. "Mills will be out to break 47.0 this week," Thomas said.

Mills' 21-flat furlong around a turn has been bettered only twice in SWC meet competition, while the performances by the Baylor 440 combine, Matina and Morton have been surpassed only thrice

The Aggies have scored in every event except the broad jump and mile in every meet this season. The lone loss thus far was in a dual meet with Texas. In that one, A&M's 440-yard relay unit lost the baton on the third leg while leading by 10 yards and then the tape as both teams were timed said.
