National Farewell Given Ike; Train Bears Body To Abilene

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the vaulted grandeur of Washington National Cathedral, mourning

leaders of America and other lands prayed Monday to the God who "maketh wars to cease" for

the eternal peace of Dwight David Eisenhower, warrior and president.

The majesty of state funeral, and the simpler tribute of Americans who had filed past the flag-draped coffin, offered a nation's farewell to the 34th president of the United States.

Ahead lies the long journey in an aged railroad baggage car halfway across the nation to Eisenhower's burial on the Kansas prairie of his boyhood.

One among the invited was missing: Milton S. Eisenhower, 68, youngest brother of the late president, taken ill three hours before the service.

Mrs. Eisenhower, veiled in black, averted her gaze as military pallbearers carried the soldier's coffin to a bier at the foot of the altar.

President Nixon and his family were among the mourners for his former chief. President Charles de Gaulle sat erect, in uniform at the rites for the man who directed the liberation of France during World War II.

The premiers of Germany and of Italy, the foes of the allies in that conflict, were there.

So were Belgium's King Baudouin, Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi of Iran, Prince George of Denmark, dozens of others from abroad.

Finally, the congregation rose to sing "Onward Christian Soldiers," and the funeral was at an end.

Murder Suspect Gives Up Monday

BEAUMONT (AP) — Herbert Thompson, 26, charged with the murder of a Prairie View A&M student, turned himself in at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department Monday.

The death of Wesley Davidson, 20, set off violence over the weekend at the Negro college. Between 20 and 50 students burned three buildings, set fire to a fourth and damaged a campus dining hall.

Davidson was stabbed in the back and stomach.

Dr. Alvin I. Thomas, college president, said most of the demonstrators were athletes. Davidson had been a football player.

Thomas estimated damage at the school at less than \$10,000.

He said a feud between the athletes and a campus veterans organization had been brewing about a month.

Earlier, Thompson told police he was beaten March 18 by a group of athletes, but refused to file charges.
