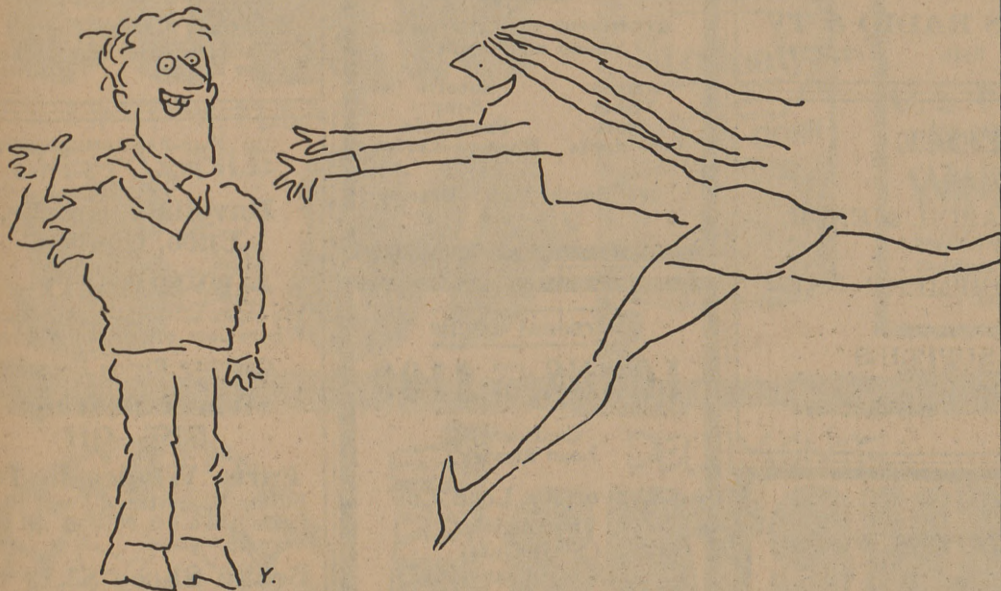
APO Sweetheart Is Maurine Turk

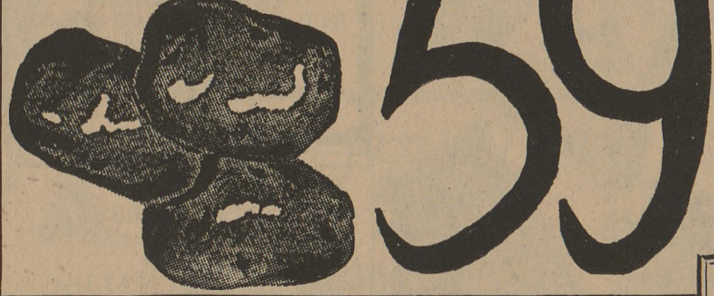
