

Ag Sweetheart, Tessies To Present Panel

Aggie Sweetheart Annella Wright and three other Texas Woman's University panelists will present the second "Man Your Manners" program here Wednesday.

Miss Wright, a sophomore special education major from Mexia, will be joined by Pat Wright, junior elementary education major, Pasadena; Karen Burk of

Brady, a junior home economics education major, and Linda McGinness, freshman clothing and textiles major from Fort Worth.

Miss Burk is secretary of the TWU Student Council of Social Activities and was an Aggie Sweetheart finalist.

The second of three "Man Your Manners" panel programs will be presented in Room 113 of the Biology Building at 7:30 p.m.

"Last week's program attracted a full house of more than 250 students," said Ronnie Owens, A&M Spring Programs vice

chairman for the sponsoring YMCA.

"The program was sprinkled with seriousness and humor, and the question-answer session produced some typical boy-meets-girl problems," Owens added.

The girls will discuss dating etiquette, from Corps trips to semi-formal and formal occasions, Owens said.

Also scheduled for discussion will be "when should drinking be a part of social activity, and the questions of smoking and necking," continued Owens.

Ducat Sale Set For Showing Of 'Everyman'

Tickets for the Aggie Players production of "Everyman," a medieval play with modern ideas, will go on sale here Monday.

The play is scheduled for a 10-night run, May 5-10 and 13-16.

Director C. K. Esten said tickets will be available at the Student Program Office in the Memorial Student Center.

All Guion Hall seats will be reserved for a specific performance. Individual tickets will be \$1 each.

"If a group of 10 or more wants to obtain seats in a block and will buy in advance, the ticket price will be reduced to 75 cents," commented Bob Wenck, assistant director. He pointed out that tickets must be purchased for a specific performance.

THE AGGIE PLAYERS' final major production of 1968-69, "Everyman" is a religious play "but we're trying to do more with it than just push Christianity," Wenck said.

"It goes deeper into morality and ethics," he added. "Everyman should make people think about the life they are leading and, perhaps, the kind of life they should be leading."

The production will be a daring combination of medieval language and poetry in a modern atmosphere through costumes, scenery, music and lighting.

"IT'S AN ageless play on 'good is good and bad is bad' and has some material that may sound new to contemporary man," Esten injected. "At the same time, 'Everyman' brings out the idea that people are people, regardless of what age in which they live."

Written six years after Columbus sailed for the new world, the allegory has a 450-year production history.

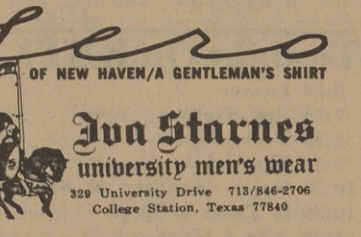

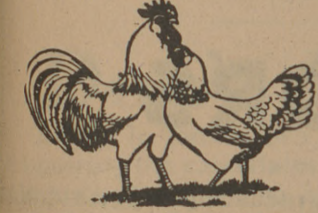
