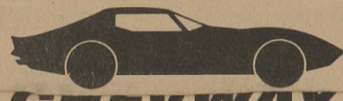

## Crowd Problems Studied By SWC

WACO, Tex. (AP) — Howard Grubbs, executive secretary of the Southwest Conference, said Thursday the handling of crowd behavior at basketball games depended on the attitude of players, coaches and the spectators themselves.

"I don't see it as a legislative problem," he said.

Grubbs said if schools wanted to file misdemeanor charges or kick a student out of school for rowdiness, it was their business.

Crowd behavior came under close scrutiny here at the annual spring meeting of the SWC with the focus on the free-for-all at the Texas A&M-Baylor game last winter.

Agreements made by the coaches among themselves included:

—Limiting coaches' trips to strictly high school track meets to the state meet in Austin, with no active recruiting to take place even then.

—Agreed not to pay expenses for any student on a recruiting junket.

—Agreed to discourage boys already signed to pre-enrollment applications from recruiting other athletes outside their own high school.

—Agreed that coaching staffs and representatives of athletic interests would not solicit employment for a prospective athlete until he signed a letter of intent.

# Aggies Sign Top Cage Star

A 6-3 schoolboy basketball star from Perryton called by Aggie Coach Shelby Metcalf "the number one guard in the state," has signed with A&M.

He is Bob Gobin, a 185-pound two-sport star who chose the Aggies from 25 scholarship offers. Among the top basketball powers eliminated by Gobin were Kansas and Oklahoma State.

Considered one of the top five prospects in the State of Texas, Gobin eventually narrowed his choice to A&M, Texas, Texas Tech and SMU before deciding on the Aggies.

Gobin said he based his decision on four points of which he placed academics first.

"I want to take a good look at the program, I want to meet and find out all I can about the boys I'll be playing with, and I want to be impressed by the coaches," Gobin had said.

"One reason I didn't become interested in Kansas is that I've heard about the problems they've been having with the SDS. I don't want to run the risk of being hampered by such things as that."

A stand-out in both football and basketball at Perryton, Gobin prefers the cage sport.

Gobin, who averaged 16.1 points per game this past season, was a two-time all-district selection in both football and basketball and he made the All

South Plains team once in basketball and twice in football.

Gobin was both an All-State and All-State Tournament team selection in basketball this past season and has been selected to play in the Coaches' All-Star basketball game. A captain in both sports, Gobin won Perryton's Fighting Heart Award in both sports also.

In his three years as a starter on the Perryton basketball team, the squad posted a combined 64-16 record. This includes a 16-6 record his sophomore season, 20-4 as a junior and 25-6 this past season.

Gobin has been impressed with A&M even before signing.

"A&M has a good tradition, and it has a lot of support. Its people always are behind the Aggies 110 per cent and they have good players and coaches," the Texas youngster had said.

In explaining why he picked basketball to concentrate on,

Gobin said he "enjoyed basketball better."

"You have to be able to do more things; you don't have to specialize so much. . . . Basketball, to me, is just a better sport all the way around."

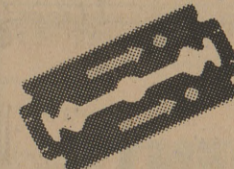

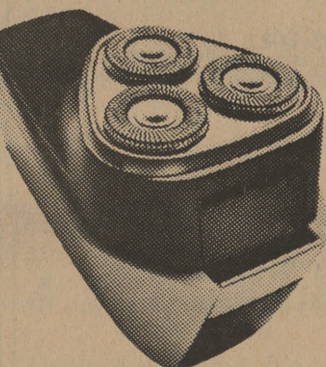
