Texas A&M University's Phys-Department has been awarded \$96,500 grant by the Air Force ffice of Scientific Research for ntinuation of studies in theoreical nuclear physics.

Dr. John Nuttall, principal instigator for the project, said ne of the major aspects of the lexas A&M program involves termination o&f new and imoved ways to solve interaction oblems of three particles.

The associate professor noted hysicists today have little difculty with problems involving o particles, but the addition of third particle presents an enrely different situation.
