

# Linemen Look To Graduation

Sixteen young electric line crewmen — 20 started out in January as rookies in the trade — are looking towards commencement in less than two weeks at Texas A&M University.

"When they leave here they will step in as good second-class linemen wherever they go," said Carl Fade, an A&M Engineering

Extension Service instructor. He pointed out it will take less than two years for them to qualify in "the top class" of linemen.

The six-month program, second of its kind at A&M, is funded by the Department of Labor as part of the Manpower Development and Training Act. It is conducted at A&M in cooperation with the Texas Employment Commission and Texas Education Agency.

All training — classroom and practical experience — is received at A&M's Research Annex, a former Air Force base.

"Things worked out good," Fade continued.

"They have really applied themselves," he continued. "They now have a background that older linemen, with 15 or 20 years experience, do not have."

Fade attributed this to classroom training, for example, in principles of electricity and theory, that on-the-job training does not provide the average lineman.

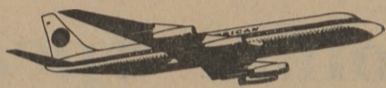
A&M linemen spend an average of 15 hours a week during the six month period in the classroom. The remainder accents actual experience.

"We have some real foreman material among these men," Fade noted.

## A&M Prof's Book Listed As One Of 12 Outstanding

A Texas A&M professor's book has been listed in Princeton's "Outstanding Books in Industrial Relations, 1968," announced Harold E. Algie, College Department editor for Harcourt, Brace and World Publishers.

Algie said the list "includes about a dozen books."

Dr. Leonard Burgess, professor of management, is author of the popular "Wage and Salary Administration in a Dynamic Economy."

William Glueck of the University of Missouri described Burgess' book as "a refreshing change from the typical ap-

proaches to wage and salary administration."

The new textbook provides basic insights into wage and salary administration as it relates to society and to such aspects of business cycles and employment.

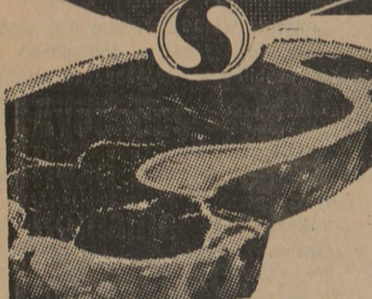
Research of material for the books is credited with Burgess being named "Outstanding Researcher" for 1968-69 in the college of Business Administration.

Burgess is author of two other books, "Managing Company Airplanes," published in 1954, and "Top Executive Pay Package," in 1964.

A graduate of Harvard and Columbia, Burgess served with the West Virginia Pulp and Paper Company as chief statistician and the National Industrial Conference Board before continuing his studies at Columbia.

He joined A&M in 1964.

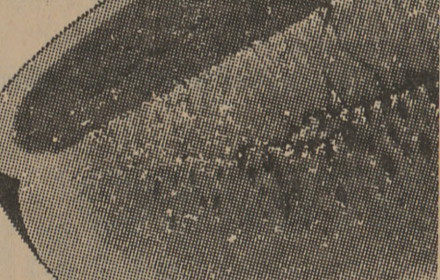

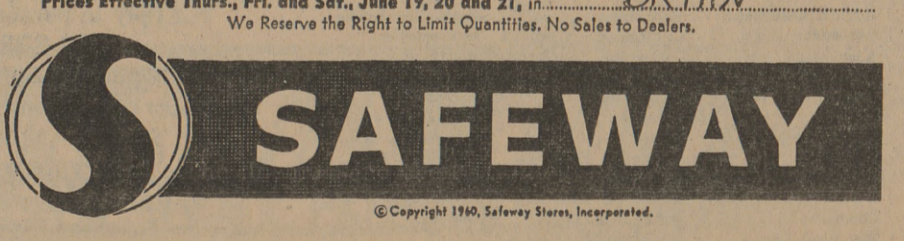
