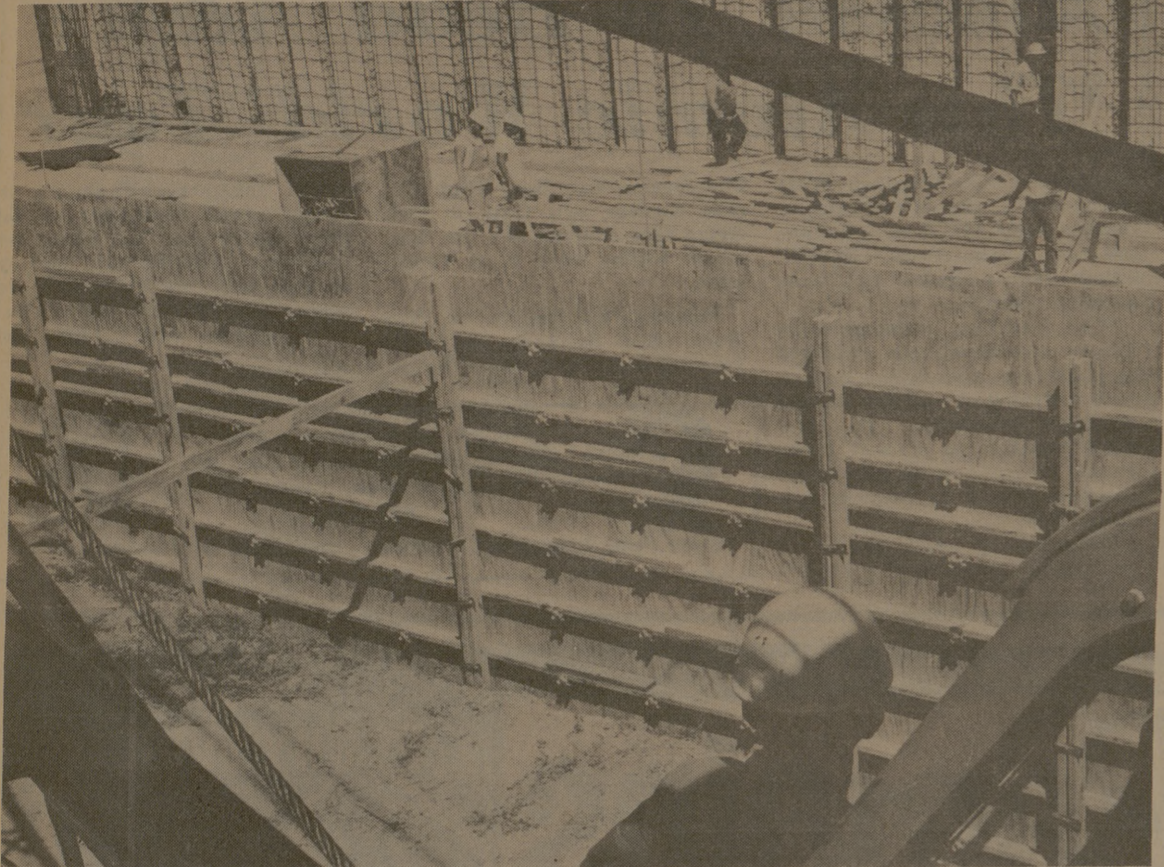


Library Displays Antique Tools

Antique tools and kitchen utensils of America's frontier days are on exhibit in the Texas A&M library.

From the collection of Dr. Leslie V. Hawkins, 50 relics of man's efforts to make life a little easier are displayed in cases near the library's main check-out desk on the first floor.

The industrial education professor's display will be on public view through the summer, announced John B. (Jack) Smith, assistant director for public services.

Exhibit items sample Dr. Hawkins' more than 800-piece collection. Many of the tools date from American Independence and are of obscure use to the casual uniformed glance. Among the wood-working tools is a molding cutter for ship lap siding and a beveling tool.

Massive iron square-shanked nails also are included in the attractive display that includes library reference materials on many of the tools.

A modern housewife would be lost using some of the 25 kitchen utensils in the display. A bottle corker, kitchen scale, carpet shut-

tle, raisin grinder, cherry pitter, sugar auger, lemon squeezer and apple peeler (which Hawkins calls "a mechanical engineer's nightmare") token the wide variety of mid-to-late 19th Century appliances a homemaker might use.

Hawkins gathered the collection from Mexico to Pennsylvania and Oregon, Pakistan, India and Saipan. His relics of bygone workshops date from the Stone Age.

"Each item tells its own story," the professor commented. "Each is a lesson in history, a story of man's struggle to reach the 'good life.' The slow, methodical progress toward a better standard of living is plainly visible."

Engineering Dean Says 'Opportunities Tremendous'

The dean of Texas A&M's College of Engineering says "tremendous opportunities" are open to young people in the engineering fields.

"Industry tells us it needs about 30,000 more engineers each year than the 58,000 who received undergraduate and graduate degrees in 1967-68 and the 52,000 in 1966-67," reports Dean Fred J. Benson.

"Competition causes excellent starting salaries and chances for advancement," the dean noted. Benson said figures released

by the American Society for Engineering Education showed U. S. colleges granted 38,002 bachelor degrees, 15,152 master's and 2,933 doctor's.

In contrast, Benson pointed out that Russia graduates 138,000 engineers a year and Japan turned out more than 200,000 engineers and scientists in 1966. "Americans have been warned repeatedly of a technical manpower crisis in the 1970's if the present trends continue," Benson exclaimed. Texas A&M's 1968 engineering

enrollment was about 3,050, up 234 over 1967. There were 906 bachelor's degrees granted in 1968, Benson reports.

A&M also granted 152 master's degrees and 40 doctor's degrees in engineering, an increase of 60 over 1967, he remarked.

Assistant Dean C. H. Ransdell, who is actively engaged in student recruitment, points out that an engineering career is not limited to the student who has exceptional grades in math and science.

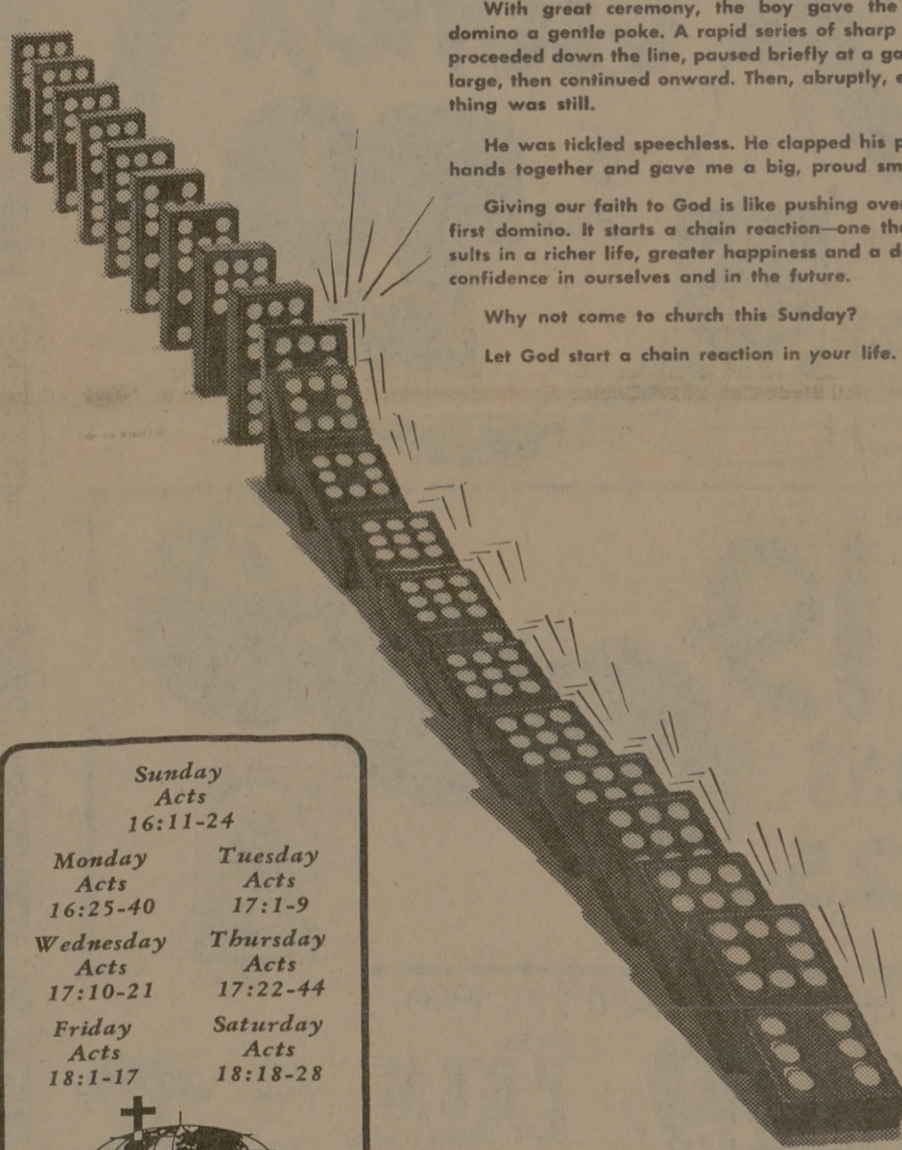
