

Aggies Face Upsetting Frogs in Cowtown Rodeo

When the Aggies invade Fort Worth Saturday they will be facing one of the most upset-minded teams in the Southwest Conference. TCU has a record to prove that they have a tendency

to forget the point spread and play their type of game.

Ever since Texas' Darrell Royal compared TCU to a den of cockroaches, the Frogs have taken it personally and knocked off the Horns five times in the last ten years. The home field

has not been a distinct factor either. Four times the Horns have taken it on the chin in Memorial Stadium, while the Frogs have pleased the home fans only once.

This year TCU has been taking their lumps more than tast-

ing victory. The Frogs, 0-4 for the season, dropped a close game to SMU last Friday night in the Cotton Bowl, 19-17. They could have easily won the game as two long drives failed to put points on the scoreboard. A pass interception and a missed field goal dashed the Purples' hopes of upset.

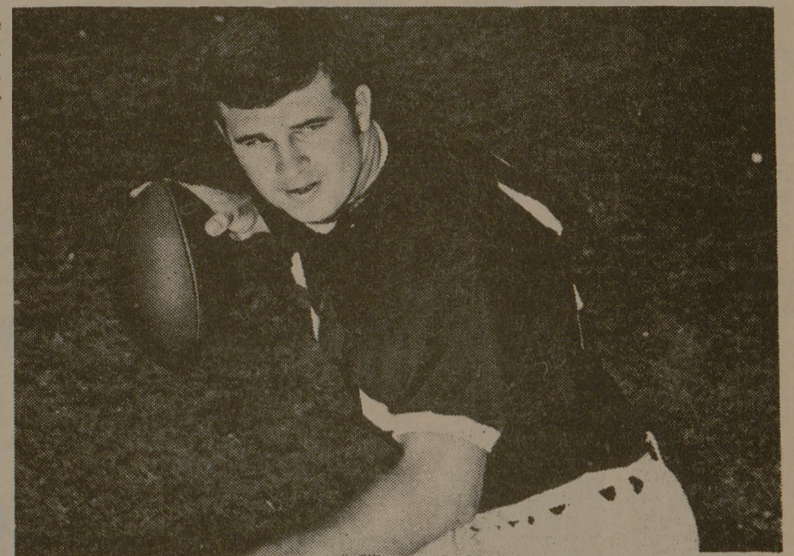
The Texas Aggies have been riding roughshod over the Christians for the past three years. The Ags whipped the Frogs in 1966 by 35-14, 1967 by 20-0, and last year by 27-7 margin.

For the past several seasons, the Cowtown boys have been plagued with the absence of a leader in the quarterback slot. However, a sophomore by the name of Steve Judy has stepped in this year and taken command

of the Frog offense.

The Judy-led machine gave a Purdue University a scare until time ran out on the Christians with the score reading 42-35 for the Boiler-makers.

The next week, the Frog defense must have stayed at the hotel as Ohio State romped 62-0. The Frogs failed to derail a streak of ten straight losing years to the Arkansas Razorbacks as the Hogs pulled out a 24-6 win. And then the Pony fiasco followed last week. But the Frogs are due for an upset and things may be a little hectic for the Aggies this Saturday afternoon in Fort Worth.

Bullet Bob Returns To Fold

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — The Dallas Cowboys will have another "bullet" in their revolver Sunday when they meet the Philadelphia Eagles in a National Football League Capitol Division game.

Bullet Bob Hayes, who has missed six weeks with a shoulder separation, is slated to start against the Eagles.

"This has been the worst time of my life," says Hayes, a split end.

He says his shoulder is still a little stiff "but I can reach up as high as I want to catch the ball — so there's no problem."

Hayes says the tremendous running of Calvin Hill should open more air routes.

He said the cornerbacks have

got to be looking for the sensational rookie or "They'll regret it."

Craig Morton, Dallas quarterback who suffered a slight shoulder injury in last week's 24-17 victory over Atlanta, is expected to begin throwing by Wednesday. Morton is leading the NFL in passing while Hill is the top rusher.

No. 3 Ranking Hard To Hold

While Texas and Arkansas rest on their laurels Saturday and Ohio State is expected to sit on Minnesota, the Southern California Trojans will be hard at work trying to protect their new No. 3 ranking.

The Trojans, 4-0 after edging Stanford 25-26 last Saturday in a giant stride toward the Rose Bowl, put their prestige on the line when they travel to South Bend, Ind., for a clash with Notre Dame.

USC must know that the Irish, with no bowl bid to shoot for, attach great importance to the rankings and need a victory to regain a Top Ten spot after jumping four places to 11th after last week's 45-0 rout of Army.

A Southern Cal victory could move it ahead of No. 2 Texas, which is idle this week along with fourth-ranked Arkansas, the team the Trojans jumped over in this week's Associated Press major college football poll.

The Trojans have little chance of catching No. 1-ranked Ohio State, an overwhelming favorite at Minnesota, 0-3-1, which has yielded 142 points in four games. Ohio State, 3-0 has scored 157 points in three games.

Several other teams in the Top Ten should have their hands full Saturday as Penn State, No. 5, plays at Syracuse; Tennessee, No. 7, plays Alabama No. 20, at Birmingham, Ala., and UCLA, No. 8, hosts California.
