Dusek is also handling the punting for the Fish. He has averaged 33.8 yards on 10 kicks.

The Fish rolled up a total offense of 354 yards against the Wogs. The majority of the yardage came in the first half as the Wog defense shut down the Fish quite effectively in the second

Penalties also plagued the Fish against the Wogs. They were guilty of 15 violations for a total of 147 yards.
