

Fish Seek Second Victory Against Cubs Tonight

The Texas Aggie Fish, fresh from a 27-26 squeaker over TCU two weeks ago, will try for their second win of the season against the Baylor Cubs here tonight.

Kickoff time is 7:30 at Kyle Field with the proceeds of the game being donated to The Brazos Valley Shrine Club for their work with crippled children.
Coach Jim Keller's crew came through the Wog game with no

injuries. The Fish will be attempting to win the seventh straight for Keller. His team went through last season with a 5-0 record last fall.
Across the line the Fish will start John Swedeen at split end,

Mike Faulkner at weak tackle, Fred Placke at weak guard, Robert Gerasimowicz at center, Buster Callaway at strong guard, Herman Mauch at strong tackle and Homer May at tight end.

Hall at strongside linebacker, Gary McCaffrey in the middle linebacker slot, and Grady Hoermann at weakside linebacker. The secondary will have Robert Murski and Gary Whitehead at safety.

Peak led the Fish rushers against the Wogs with 56 yards in 16 carries while Jimmy Aycock has 41 yards in 13 carries and a touchdown.

James completed 9 of 28 against the Wogs for 201 yards and two touchdowns. He had a tremendous first half but he saw several passes dropped in the second half by his receivers. His favorite target was split end Swedeen who caught 4 for 120 yards. He made a fantastic catch between two TCU players just before the half for a 49-yard touchdown strike. The other aerial strike was scored by reserve split end Glenn McNatt, a 24-yarder from James.

Davidson's Slade Named Offensive Back Of Week

DAVIDSON, N.C. (AP)—Gordon Slade spent his first two years of college football at Davidson the bench.
"I was a second-string quarterback my freshman year," said Slade, "My sophomore year I just filled in a little."
But the quarterback who had been the starter on Slade's freshman team switched to another position, and the varsity signal

caller graduated. So during his junior year last season, Slade made the first string.
This week Slade, who engineered Davidson's brilliant 37-7 upset over Richmond, Southern Conference defending champion, was named offensive Back of the Week by The Associated Press.
The 6-foot-1, 195-pounder from Evansville, Ind., completed 32 of 43 passes for 285 yards, scored

three touchdowns and passed for the other two as Davidson, long a weakling in the conference, emerged on top of the league.
Behind Slade's passing, Davidson has won four games this season against no losses, something no other Wildcat team has done since 1927. The other victories have been over Guilford, 21-8; Furman, 77-14; and Trinity, 17-16.

The Fish defenses will line up Ralph Sacra at left end, Butch Kamps at left guard, Boice Best at right guard, Gary Martin at right end, and Kent Findley at rover. Linebackers will be Greg

Dusek is also handling the punting for the Fish. He has averaged 33.8 yards on 10 kicks.
The Fish rolled up a total offense of 354 yards against the Wogs. The majority of the yardage came in the first half as the Wog defense shut down the Fish quite effectively in the second half.
Penalties also plagued the Fish against the Wogs. They were guilty of 15 violations for a total of 147 yards.

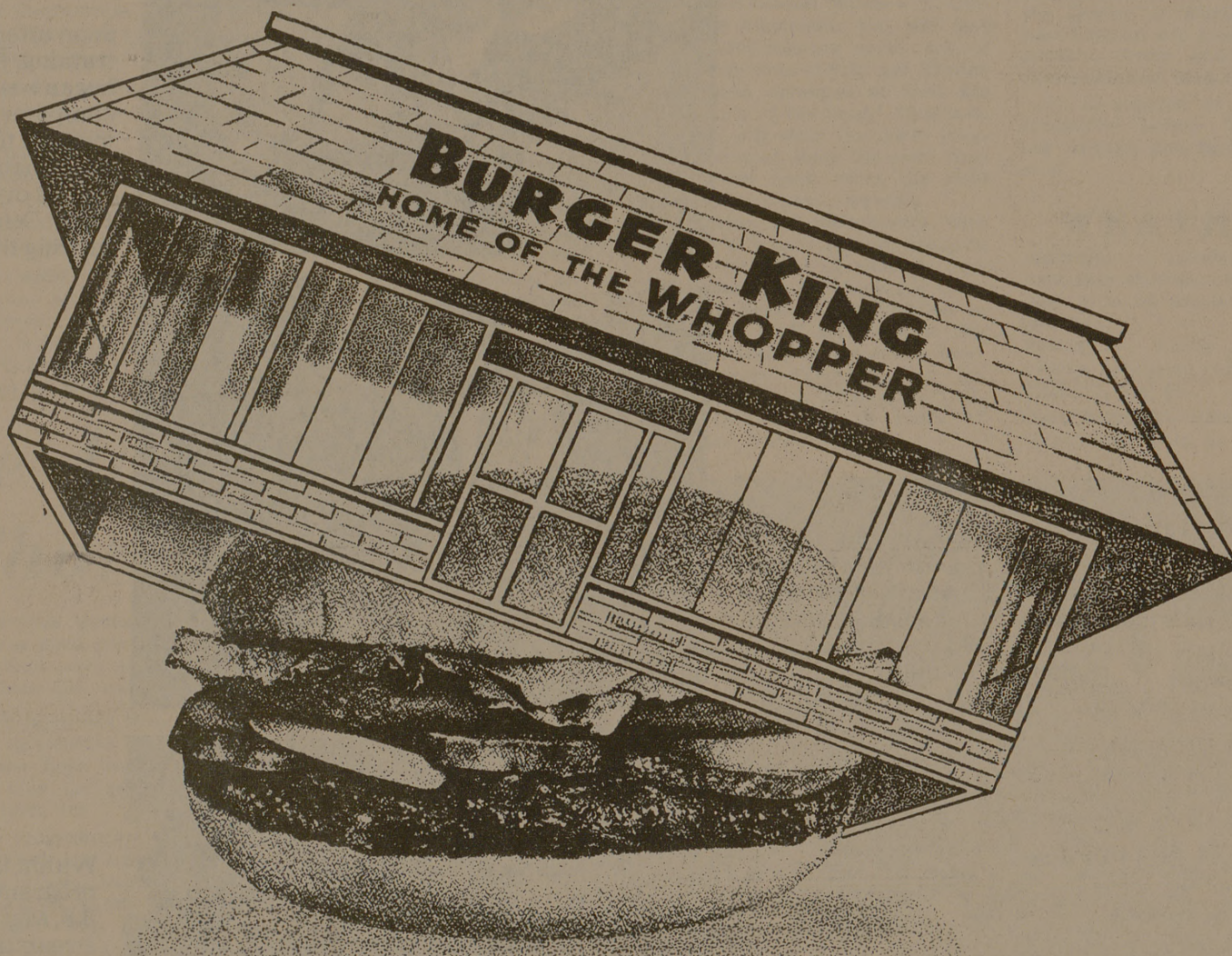
