A native of Celina, Dr. Murray graduated from Sudan High School and received a bachelor of arts degree from Texas Tech. She received the master's of education degree from Sam Houston State University.

Dr. Murray started her teaching career at Barstow High School in 1954, leaving there in 1958 to teach English and journalism at Huntsville High School. She joined Texas A&M in 1960 as assistant professor of education. She taught undergraduate courses in secondary education until 1963, when she left A&M to work on a Ph.D. at the University of Houston.

After receiving the Ph.D., she returned to A&M in 1967 as a graduate and undergraduate teacher of curriculum and instruction. She left the university in June, 1969.
