The third event, the Marshall Plan, took place in June as the United States began to spread its technological knowledge abroad for the first time, she continued.

She said, the United States did not do these things with a feeling of crisis but with the feeling for a need in the improvement of living conditions abroad as well as at home.

Foreign policy, she said, could now be used as a political weapon for the first time in history on an extensive basis.

The diplomatic revolution that began in 1947 has brought about a social revolution, Mrs. Rostow

This revolution, she explained, was based on such things as education and income.

For the first time the United States began to develop the theory on which the nation was founded: Equality, she claimed.

U.S. Democracy

The Korean War was a major stepping stone in the early development of this social advancement, she said, since it was the first war in which the United States troops were integrated.

Justice, the third problem, she said, is defined as the ability of the Constitution to fulfill ultir mate needs of the people.

The problems of justice are many, Mrs. Rostow said, adding that it was impressive that America despite its enormous population has been able to work to bring the influence of the times to the individual level.
