For the first time the United States began to develop the theory on which the nation was founded: Equality, she claimed.

The third event, the Marshall Plan, took place in June as the United States began to spread its technological knowledge abroad for the first time, she continued.

She said, the United States did not do these things with a feeling of crisis but with the feeling for a need in the improvement of living conditions abroad as well as at home.

Foreign policy, she said, could now be used as a political weapon for the first time in history on an extensive basis.

The diplomatic revolution that began in 1947 has brought about a social revolution, Mrs. Rostow said.

This revolution, she explained, was based on such things as education and income.

Edward King of Graham won the Southwestern Open American Checker Federation Tournament here Sunday by outscoring Maj. (ret.) John J. Caldwell of Albuquerque, the New Mexico state champion.

King, who has been runner-up repeatedly in the Southwestern Open, won the \$100 cash prize and trophy for his first time on honor points.

King and Caldwell each scored 11 out of a possible 14 tournament points.

The two-day tourney brought 33 checker players from throughout the nation for the ACF-recognized championship.

The program materials include poems, songs and information about Arbor Day and trees suitable for presentation at an Arbor Day observance.

Sociologists to Give Film Presentation

Films on social problems of poverty and social class will be shown tonight and Wednesday by three A&M sociologists as an educational supplement to several of their sociology courses.

The films, sponsored by Dr. William P. Kuvlesky, W. Kennedy Upham, and Earl L. Copeland, will be shown each day from 7 to 9 p.m. in Room 113, Biological Sciences building.

Scheduled for viewing tonight are "The Golden Mountain on Mott Street," describing problems of assimilation faced by a Chinese immigrant; and "Segregation Northern Style," a CBS documentary exploring problems of racial segregation.

Set for Wednesday night are "Christmas in Appalachia," a description of the stark effects of rural poverty in Appalachia; and "The Tenement," a CBS news film focusing on the conditions of slum life in a metropolis.

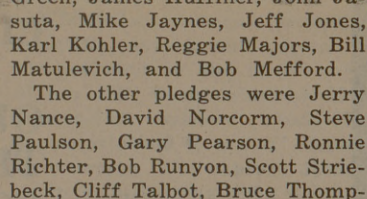
