

Mississippi's jolting 38-0 victory over Tennessee and Notre Dame's decision to get back into the bowl business created a wild flurry at the 12 noon EST deadline imposed by the NCAA.

The Orange Bowl at Miami quickly grabbed up fifth-ranked Penn State, pride of the East, and powerful Missouri, co-leader of the Big Eight Conference. Tennessee and Florida were matched in the Gator Bowl at Jacksonville, Fla., Dec. 27. Auburn, Georgia and Alabama accepted bids to lesser games.

Louisiana State, with a gaudy 9-1 mark, said it didn't want to go anywhere. Shut out of the majors, its only choice was the Bluebonnet Bowl at Houston.




