While most students attend college with one future in mind, a freshman from Corpus Christi thinks a college education will help him in two fields—ranching and creative writing.

William S. Harte hopes to be a cattleman and poet-short story writer someday, and he has already made dents in both areas.

"I found poetry came fairly easy and I like to do it," the Corpus Christi Ray High School graduate admits.

Will, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Harte, is an animal science major.

Ranching got into his blood during trips to the family ranch near Laredo. He thinks there is a great future in ranching and picked Texas A&M because of its reputation in agriculture science.

Will is currently working on a group of poems he hopes to have published. His freshman English teacher, Mrs. Judith Finn, will provide technical help.

Harte finds creative writing is a lot of hard work. "It takes up a lot of time with

constant rewriting," he noted. "I write mainly light poetry and most of what I've done has been without any professional background."

Harte has written over 100 poems, with several published in the Ray High School paper. He also has written several short stories.

Writing talent is nothing new for the Harte family, however.

Will's father is publisher of the Corpus Christi Caller-Times and his grandfather, Houston Harte, is president of Harte-Hanks, Inc., a chain of Texas newspapers.

Turkey Trot for Joggers Slated for Thanksgiving

The first Aggie Turkey Trot will be conducted Thanksgiving morning at Texas A&M.

The jog, run or walk—depending upon the individual — will start at 8:30 a.m. in front of G. Rollie White Coliseum and is open to all persons interested in demonstrating physical fitness, announced Dr. Carl W. Landis, Health and Physical Education Department head.

Appropriate certificates will be presented to all persons finishing the 3.2-mile course around the golf course and back to the coliseum.

"There is no fee nor requirements for participation other than being at the coliseum at 8:30," noted Dr. John M. Chevrette, health and physical education professor.

He said there will be no emphasis on placing or winning. "The Turkey Trot is strictly to emphasize physical fitness," Chevrette added. "With all the calories most folks will be taking in that day, this should provide an excellent opportunity to expend a few."

"There will be plenty of time to get home, get ready and back to Kyle Field for the game," he observed.

Expected participants are joggers among A&M exes who will be here for the A&M-Texas game, campus visitors, local citizens, members of area high school track teams and the A&M cross country team.

"This is a community-wide event and is not limited to A&M students, faculty and staff,"

Chevrette said. "We are particularly interested in women and youngsters participating, perhaps the whole family."

"Each individual is expected to set his or her own pace and whether running, jogging or walking, to finish back at the coliseum," the Aggie 100-Mile Club organizer continued.

Starter will be 85th District Judge W. C. (Bill) Davis. The 3.2-mile trot will start with the cross country regular route. It runs south from the coliseum to Jersey Ave. around the golf course, past the corps area and west on Joe Blvd. to the coliseum. Chevrette said the route will be marked.
