# Mormon Astronaut To Speak Thursday

"Space, Science and Religion" from a Mormon astronaut's point of view will be on tap Thursday at 7:15 p.m. in the Bryan Ward Chapel of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, 101 N. Coulter Drive.

Dr. Don L. Lind, a physicist who received his PhD. in highenergy nuclear physics from the University of California at Berkeley, expects to be assigned to a moon mission in the next three years.

An expert on lunar surface operations from moon walking to experiments performed on the face of the moon, Lind was at a console in Mission Control in Houston during the moon walk of astronauts Neil Armstrong and Edwin Aldrin to advise them of what to do if anything went wrong with the lunar experiment packages.

Lind's work takes him to research laboratories and firms working on the space effort all over the United States. He also travels widely outside the United States visiting laboratories and tracking stations.
