Registration Procedures for the Department of Wildlife Science

The hours passed at the preliminary grade report period on November 10, 1969 may be used in satisfying this ninety-five hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation may now leave their names with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building. She, in turn, will check all records to determine ring eligibility. Orders for these rings will be taken by the Ring Clerk between November 24, 1969 and January 6, 1970. The rings will be returned to the Registrar's Office to be delivered on or about February 20, 1970. The ring clerk is on duty from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, Monday through Friday, of each week.

we have here is a blatant attack on the senses. They use all the tricks and use them well, generally wringing every last thrill out of the listened.

Page, not known for playing economically, is the obvious focal point of the group. It all revolves around him. Most of the songs are built around one or more of his rhythmic bassy riffs that incite joyous movement of the body. His strident solos are the epitome of flash. It is his show and he does it well.

Though perhaps not quite as dazzling as Page, lead vocalist, Robert Plant makes his presence felt in a dramatic way. His voice is an elastic object capable of emitting almost as many different sounds as Page's guitar. He moans, prisses around, screams as if in ecstasy or violent pain, and contributes generously to the overall good time.

"Whole Lotta Love" is the prime mover of the album and is particularly arresting when listening to on head phones, because of the imaginative use of stereo. A sequence from their live performances and a direct steal from Howling Wolf's "Killing Floor" gave birth to the "Lemon Song", which contains one of Plant's most desperate and effective vocals. "Bring It On Home," with blues growl and harp playing from Plant, is another of the outstanding cuts.

It is a credit to Page's production ability that despite all the elements of the Led Zeppelin

sound that would tend to cause the record to sound cluttered and muddy, it sounds clean and smooth like a Beatles album. Keeping in mind their own self-imposed limitations, this is an exceptionally good album.

### MOTHER EARTH PRESENTS TRACY NELSON COUNTRY—Mother Earth

Although the title states that this is a new album by Mother Earth, it could be more accurately described as a solo album by Tracy Nelson. As one who just could not get enough of her on the two Mother Earth records, this comes as a slight disappointment. The important thing her voice, is still fine but the instrumental work is not as tight or imaginative as Mother Earth's usual work.

The music is unadulterated country, as opposed to a rock group's interpretation of country. For instance, most of the songs are country classics such as "Stand By Your Man" and "I'm So Lonesome I Could Cry." Two exceptions, one written by ex-Steve Miller Band member, Boz Scaggs, and one co-written by Tracy Nelson and Bob Arthur, are competent, but not noteworthy. In fact, that is the problem of the entire album. It is all competent, but is mediocre and pedestrian. Nothing really jells. There is little excitement.

Dr. Carter is a two-year board member of the American Association of University Women and serves as its Area Representative for World Problems. For six years she was a member of the AAUW international relations committee.

The Canadian-born professor became a U. S. citizen in 1948. She taught at McMaster and Wellesley, Tufts and Smith Colleges. Dr. Carter joined the Northwest-ern faculty in 1964.

The International Political Science Association member received the AAUW achievement award, George V Medal for Public Services, Radcliffe's distinguished achievement medal and an American Academy of Arts and Sciences fellowship in 1965.

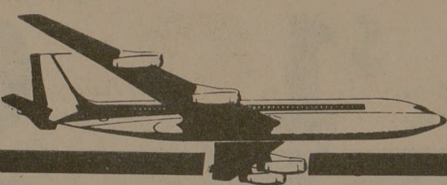
## Consolidated Choir To Perform In University National Lobby
