The 23-year-old Dominican was selected for the \$300 award on the basis of grades. He has the highest grade point ratio (3.88 on a 4 point system) in the College of Agriculture.

The scholarship, provided by the Borden Company Foundation, was presented by A&M President Earl Rudder and Dr. H. O. Kunkel, dean of the College of Agriculture.

The student came to A&M three and a half years ago and is now one of about 85 Dominicans attending the university. His education here is sponsored by a U.S. Agency for International Development - Dominican Republic program.

Ceballos said he is anxious to return to his home country after graduation and go to work in agriculture. His special interest is soil and water engineering, and he says the Dominican Republic needs trained people in this field.
