# **Convicts to Stage 'Spectacular'** Here

Department of Corrections will highlight the first "Spectacular" program of 1970 Sunday night at the First Baptist Church in Col-

lege Station. The convicts will present "Operation Teenager," an effort to steer teens away from the errors that end in prison life.

"Spectacular" is held every six weeks during the regular 7:20 p.m. services.

Operation Teenager had its beginning in the consciences of four inmates who came to the conclusion that serving a sentence doesn't repay a thing.

Four inmates from the Texas cent of the population of the Texas Department of Corrections is between the ages of 17 and 24.

Although the program is aimed at young people, the convicts will include suggestions for parents and other adults during the presentation.

Everyone is represented in prison.

"It can happen to you," a convict added, "we believe there are no exceptions."

The identity of the convicts is kept secret, yet their program will be scrupulously honest.

"In every case, a decisive turn was taken during the teenage years, a turn that eventually brought us to the point of extreme crime and imprisonment," one of the speakers maintains.

At 4 p.m. Today Dr. J. Robert Wayland of the University of Maryland's Physics and Astronomy Department will present a physics colloquium today.
