Aggie Fish Slip By Texas, 73-70

It didn't really resemble a basketball game, but the Texas A&M Fish bucked and battled their way through a foul-riddled game last night to hand the Texas Yearlings a 73-70 defeat.

It was the first loss for the Yearlings who entered the contest with a 5-0 mark. It became the fourth straight win for the Fish, who are now 2-0 in the conference race.

The Fish had to overcome a cold shooting performance and the rough tactics of the Yearlings, who gave the Fish their best challenge in the rebounding department for the year. Texas hit on 22 of 50 from the field for 44 per cent while the Fish could manage but 22 of 65 for a meager 34 per cent.

With much of the action coming under the boards, the referees' whistle became a constant sound as both teams totaled 70 free throws. The Fish hit 29 of 40 while the Yearlings converted 26 of 35. The Fish won the battle for the rebounds with 50 to 44 for the hometowners but the Yearlings won the turnover race with 15 to 13 for A&M.

The Fish led at halftime 44-35 but could connect for only 29 of 50 in the second stanza as the Yearlings again rang up 35. The Yearlings played his best game of the year by scoring 23 points with 13 coming from the free throw line in many attempts. He also hit five of nine and became the only Fish to hit better than 50 per cent from the field.

Bob Gobin added 11 while Jim Overhouse had nine. Wayne Hensard, Bryan Mezger, and Charlie Jenkins contributed eight apiece with Mezger getting 10 rebounds to lead the Fish on the boards.

John Wilson had 27 points and 10 rebounds for the Yearlings.

One-Way Street?

By Jack Keever Associated Press Writer AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) — "Sir" James Street, the toast of the Texas Longhorns, thought as a teen-age schoolboy he might, just might, make the squad as a defensive back.

Defensive back?

The explosive, unbeaten quarterback of the nation's No. 1 college football team a defensive back?

"Well, yeah, I really thought my future might lie in baseball," he said.

"That was my basis for coming to the University of Texas. I had always liked Arkansas, but Texas had a real good baseball program. Coach Darrell Royal told me that after my freshman year if I could make the team I could play baseball, too."

Street — who got so excited at times he would double his fist and slug the air — has guided the Longhorns to 20 straight victories, two Southwest Conference football titles and the national championship this past season.

Longhorn fans feel the last two triumphs, nationally televised games against Arkansas and Notre Dame, were the most important to Texas football since it started in 1893, moving Texas closer to the Fighting Irish as the glamor team of college football.

Street almost single-handedly beat the Razorbacks, 15-14, and he made the clutch plays in Texas' 21-17 Cotton Bowl victory over the Irish.

But now the pressure is off. At 21, relaxed and affable, flaring sideburns neatly trimmed, Street sat at a friend's house and talked about his athletic career.

"I feel certain I've played my last down of football," said the Longview senior, who at 5-foot-4 and 175 pounds appears too small to have played in big-time football. "And I've got to improve a lot to have any future in baseball."

"My best pitch is my curve. I'm not overpowering at all, as professional scouts look for a pitcher who can throw the ball hard. I probably have to develop another pitch."

Street, who has one year of baseball eligibility left, has won 21 games and lost 6 in two seasons with a combined earned run average of 1.96 for 198 2/3 innings, a lot of work for a college pitcher.

He has struck out 224 batters, including 125 as a sophomore, fewer than the school record for a single season by the famed Bobby Layne in 1946.

Street has never made a fielding error.

The comparison between him and Layne, both quarterbacks and righthanded pitchers, is often made although Layne went on to become a great professional football player.
