Photojournalist to Lecture Next Month

A nationally-known professional photographer will present an exhibit and lecture at A&M Feb. 10, announced H. F. Eilers of the sponsoring Journalism Department.

Mike Tatem, award winning photojournalist and national technical representative for Honeywell Photographic Products, Inc., will speak at 8 p.m. in the Architecture Auditorium. A large exhibit of Tatem's work will be on display in the Architecture Foyer the same day.

Eilers noted the lecture is open to the public.

Tatem's background includes almost every facet of the photographic profession. He is regional vice president of the American Society of Magazine Photographers and a member of The National Press Photographers Association.

Tatem received the Kenneth P. McLaughlin Award of Merit from the NPPA in 1968 and was awarded honorary membership in Kappa Alpha Mu, the national photojournalism fraternity, in 1967.

During the past two years Tatem has had approximately 45 "one-man" print shows and was commissioned by Bell and Howell to do a 76-print exhibit for Photo Expo '69.

The Denver resident has had his work in most major publications, including House Beautiful, Vogue, Architectural Forum, Glamour, Leica Photography, Popular Photography, Modern Photography, Saga, Radio and TV Mirror, The Bride, Living, Ladies Home Journal and Der Spiegel.

Tatem was a guest instructor at Ohio University, University of Illinois, Layton School of Art and Winona School of Professional Photography. He has lectured to numerous professional photographic organizations. As vice president and manager of technical services for Ethol Photo Chemical Corp., he has done considerable research on films and developers.

Calhoun Named Chairman Of Federal Marine Panel

Dr. John C. Calhoun, vice president of programs and director of the Sea Grant Program at A&M, was appointed chairman of a Marine Affairs Action Group Jan. 20 by U. S. Interior Secretary Walter J. Hickel.

The eight-man group includes leaders from science and industry specializing in marine activities. It will advise on strengthening marine programs in the Interior Department. Calhoun is a former science advisor to the department.

"Since I became secretary, I have given priority attention to the department's marine programs," Hickel said. "Interior's budget for ocean affairs is about 35 percent of the total federal civilian effort in marine activities. Scattered among some 12 bureaus and offices, however, these departmental programs require greater coordination and integration."

"A start in this direction," the secretary continued, "was made through the establishment of the Office of Marine Resources. It has become apparent, however, that a stronger organizational thrust is needed."

"In two of these programs," Hickel went on, "this department has been assigned lead agency responsibility, namely, coastal zone management and the establishment of coastal zone laboratories. If we are to meet our increasing responsibilities for developing the oceans' resources and for protecting the nation's marine environment, we must streamline our management structure."

Secretary Hickel asked the newly appointed group for a complete review of the department's marine programs; an examination of the recommendations and conclusions of recent ocean policy studies, including the report of the Commission on Marine Science, Engineering and Resources; selection of concrete departmental goals for ocean use and development in light of new Administration directives, and a determination of relative priorities for these goals and time frames for their attainment.
