The A&M Livestock Judging Team won second place honors in the senior college division during the Fort Worth Livestock Exposition and Fat Stock Show last week.

Eighteen teams and 90 individuals from major colleges and universities competed in the judging.

Iowa State University was first, University of Arizona won third, and the University of Nebraska took fourth.

A&M team members were Gaylon Patterson of Crockett, Tommy Eckert of Mason, Melvin Young of Tulia, Frank Craddock, of Medina, Larry Beerwinkle of Temple and Bill Obst of Victoria.

Coach L. D. Wythe, Jr., of the A&M Animal Science Department said Patterson and Eckert were fifth place high point individuals in the overall contest. Patterson was high individual in Quarter Horse judging, and Eckert was second high in sheep.

As a team, the Aggies were first in Quarter Horses and sheep, Wythe said.

2 Faculty Confabs Scheduled Here

Two faculty development computer conferences will be held at A&M this month for representa-

tives from four other institutions participating in Texas Regional Academic Computing Experiment.

TRACE is a National Science Foundation program coordinated by Texas A&M to enhance the computer capabilities of Sam Houston State, Texas Southern, Prairie View A&M and Tarleton State.

Approximately 25 mathematics and engineering professors will attend a Feb. 20-21 session, announced Dr. Roger Elliott, assistant professor of industrial engineering at Texas A&M and TRACE coordinator. Business and economics faculty members will be here for another two-day session beginning Feb. 27.

John Kinross-Wright, MD, commissioner of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Retardation will speak at the annual dinner of the Brazos County Counseling Service at 7 p.m. Feb. 19, at the Holiday Inn.

The dinner will be open to the public and reservations may be

Dr. Kinross-Wright will speak on the ingredients necessary for good mental health in a community.

He added that the counseling service is now an outpatient Mental Health Clinic for both children and adults, but its objectives remain the same as when the agency was started.
