"NET Playhouse," now in its fourth season of production, will be shown every Wednesday night at 7:30. Dramas to be shown include the works of American, British and Canadian playwrights, with the show producers constant-ly looking for new talent.

"NET Festival" is the home for all non-drama performance programs and generally for documentary and informational programs in the arts. Featured will be materials dealing with creative artists both of the past and present, performing groups in all areas of theater, masterworks of all periods, and unusual film studies of places, people and


