A&M Grad Elected Pet. E. President

For the second time in three years, an A&M graduate has been elected president of the Society of Petroleum Engineers.

The 1970 head of the nationwide organization is Robert H. McLemore of Dallas, president of Otis Engineering Corp. and a 1933 petroleum engineering graduate of Texas A&M.

Two years ago, the position was held by H. J. Gruy, also of Dallas, who earned his petroleum engineering degree at A&M in 1937. Gruy is president of H. L. Gruy & Associates.

Two Texas A&M faculty members, Dr. John C. Calhoun Jr. and Dr. Richard A. Morse, also are SPE past presidents.

Dr. Ohno Cancels Due to Illness

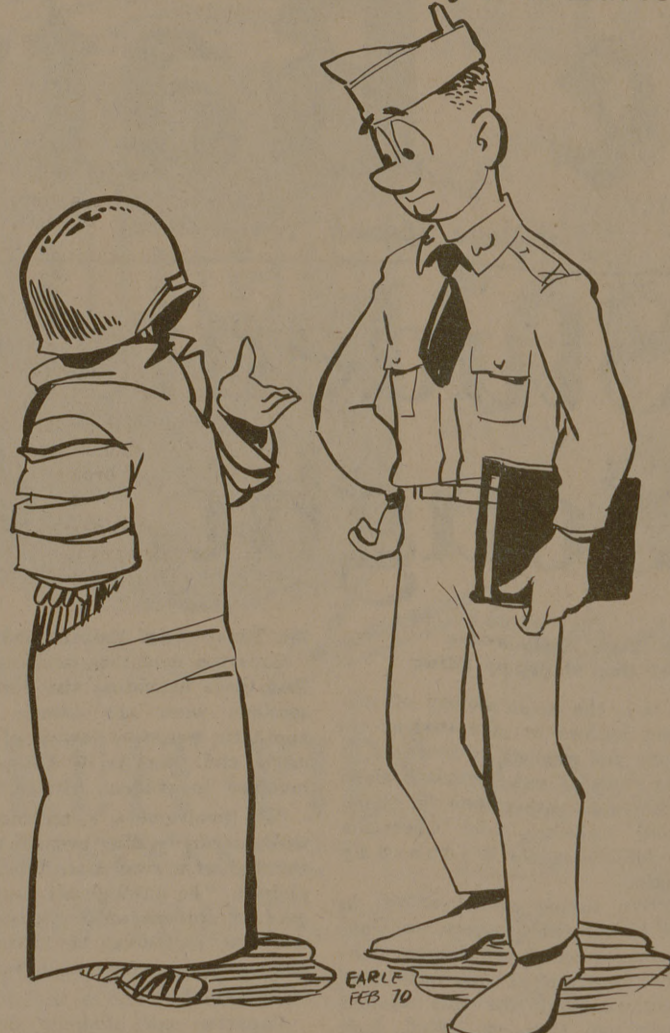
