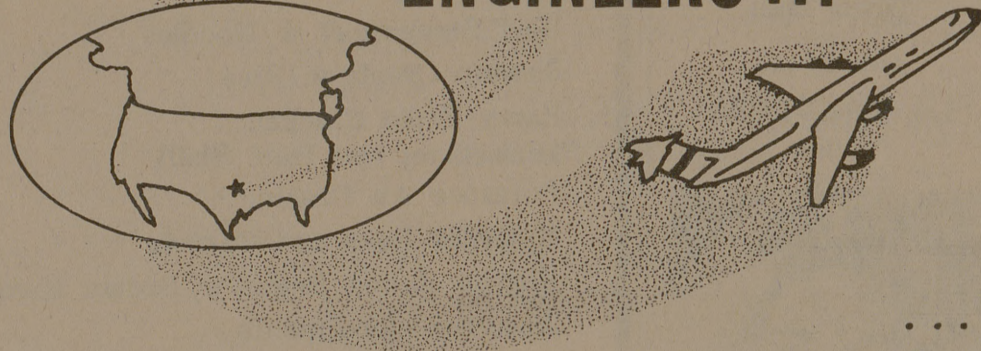

The afternoon doubleheader will start at 1 p.m. with a seven-inning game to be followed by a nine-inning contest.

Chandler has nominated junior southpaw Doug Rau of Columbus to pitch the opener and senior righthander Dave Benesh of Houston St. Thomas to work the nightcap.

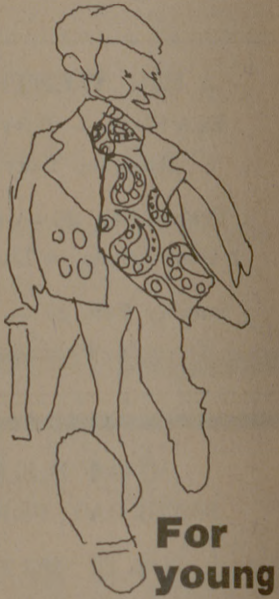
Sans, first base, Jim Raley, shortstop, Billy Hodge, catcher, and Rau (first game) and Benesh (second game), pitcher.

Jazzie Cazzie Helping Knicks

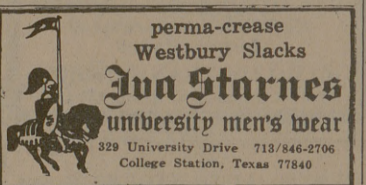
NEW YORK (AP)—Cazzie Russell has so much enthusiasm it seems to have spilled over onto both ends of the basketball court.
