

APO Sponsoring Tub Pull Saturday

The A&M Chapter of Alpha Phi Omega will be pulling a bath-

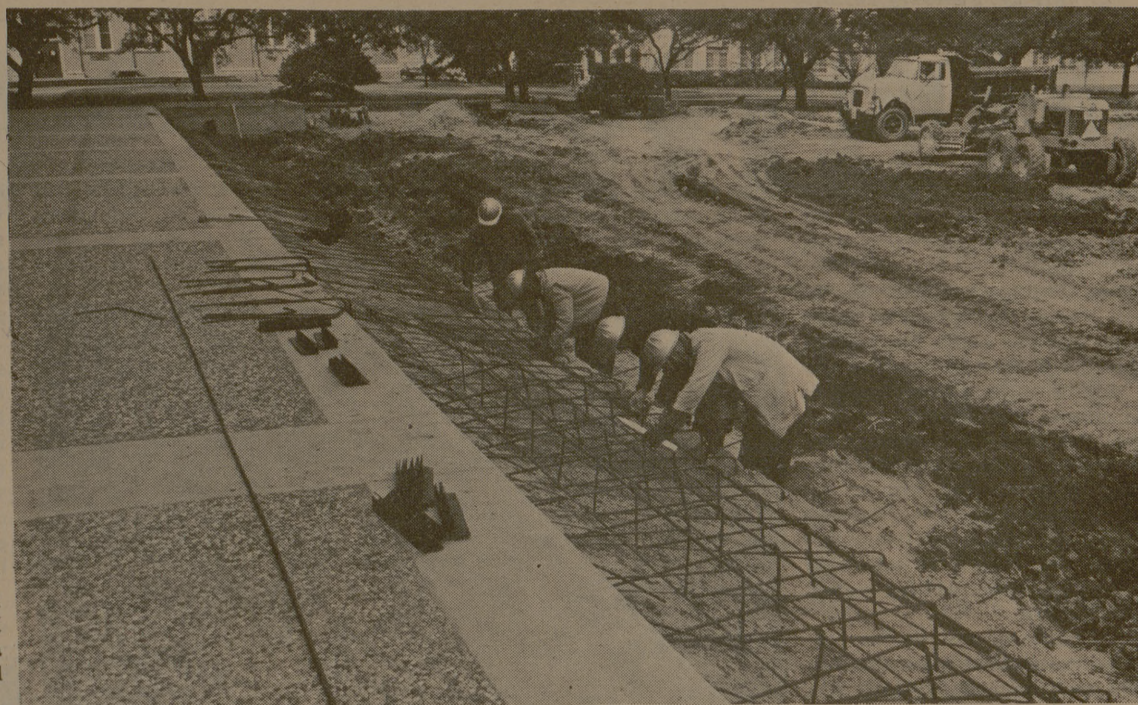
tub through the Bryan-College Station area Saturday to collect donations for the Texas Heart Fund.

William Cronrath, public relations director for the A&M chapter, said the annual tub pull is sponsored by APO chapters from surrounding East Texas colleges in cooperation with the Texas Heart Fund Association.

The tub, which began its journey today in Houston, is scheduled to arrive in Bryan-College Station around 11 a.m. Saturday after passing through Conroe and Huntsville. Members of the A&M chapter will pull it through area shopping centers and then send it on to Bastrop around 3 p.m.

APO members will deliver the tubful of money to Heart Association officials in Austin Sunday after pulling it through San Marcos and Austin.

Last year's tub pull netted \$500 in donations for the Heart Fund. The money collected will be used in financing research in the fight against heart disease.
