Health Ed Majors To Hold Seminar

A&M health education majors will hear Dr. Robert Kaplan of Ohio State speak on "Consumer Health" in a Tuesday seminar. The Health Education Seminar will be from 4 to 5 p.m. in the Architecture Auditorium, announced Dr. Carl W. Landiss, Health and Physical Education Department head.

Originally scheduled for March 10, the address by Dr. Kaplan has been changed to Tuesday, explained Melba Hartford, health education instructor who coordinates the seminars.

She said other students, faculty-staff and the public will be welcome at the Tuesday seminar.

Professor of health education in Ohio State's School of Physical Education, Kaplan for three years was an official of the American Medical Association. He was health-fitness consultant and staff coordinator for the committee on exercise and physical fitness.

Grad Student to Get Teaching Award

Charles D. Mickey, A&M graduate student in chemistry, will receive the James Bryant Conant Award in High School Chemistry Teaching at the May meeting of the American Chemical Society in Toronto.

The coveted award is sponsored by E. I. du Pont de Nemours and Co. Inc.

Mickey currently is working toward a Ph.D. in inorganic chemistry at Texas A&M under Dr. Ralph A. Zingaro.

The Florida native taught 11 years at Alamo Heights High School in San Antonio. During the period from 1957, Mickey also

taught chemistry a year at San Antonio College.

His students generally dominated the ACS competitive exam in chemistry for San Antonio area students. Mickey's students placed first, second, fourth, fifth and seventh in the top 10 positions in 1969. In 1968, they took first and third and, in 1964, nine of the first 10 places.

Cystic Fibrosis Detection

(Continued from page 1) Medicine groups centered their analyses on sodium content. Research soon revealed, however, that nail clippings from newborn infants are often sodium contaminated, making such an analysis alone unreliable.

The standard means for cystic fibrosis detection is the "sweat test" in which the sodium, chloride and potassium concentrations observed in cystic fibrosis patients has been found to be two to five times the concentration found in normal individuals.

"Immediately following birth," Dr. Fite pointed out, "the sweat glands are inactive, so such a test cannot be used as a screening method to detect cystic fibrosis

in newborn infants."

The "sweat test" also is time-consuming, making it undesirable for a mass screening program.

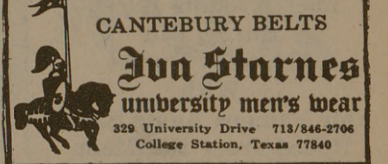
Doctors believe the cystic fibrosis frequency is approximately one in each one thousand births.

"This doesn't sound like too much," Dr. Harrison remarked, "but it takes on a different significance when you consider the profound medical effects of the disease."

"Through early detection and improved pulmonary and dietary management, studies have shown a significant number of cystic fibrosis children can survive to late adolescent and adult life," Dr. Harrison said.

The Activation Analysis Research Laboratory has analyzed nail clippings for sodium content from approximately 2,000 children born in Houston and Bryan.

This program has already been credited with discovery of one cystic fibrosis case.

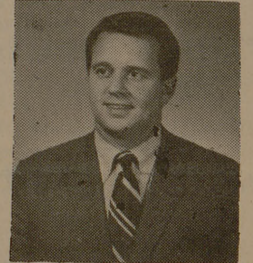
