Medicine groups centered their analyses on sodium content. Research soon revealed, however, that nail clippings from newborn infants are often sodium contaminated, making such an analysis alone unreliable.

The standard means for cystic fibrosis detection is the "sweat test" in which the sodium, chlorine and potassium concentrations observed in cystic fibrosis patients has been found to be two to five times the concentration found in normal individuals.

"Immediately following birth," Dr. Fite pointed out, "the sweat glands are inactive, so such a test cannot be used as a screening method to detect cystic fibrosis


