

Annual Ag Career Day Set March 14

High school students throughout the state are being invited to participate in the university's annual College of Agriculture Career Day March 14.

Dean of Agriculture H. O. Kunkel said activities will include practice judging contests for 4-H Club and Future Farmers of America members. Events are livestock, dairy cattle, dairy products, poultry, meats, land, land evaluation (4-H only), and range and pastures.

He said judging starts promptly at 8 a.m. in the Animal Husbandry Pavilion. Career Day exhibits will be on display from 8:15 a.m. to 2 p.m. on the first floor of Plant Sciences.

Exhibits will present information on careers and study programs in the many fields of agriculture. More than 15 displays are planned.

Faculty and student representatives will be available to talk with students, answer questions and distribute brochures.

"Anyone interested in the challenging field of agriculture is encouraged to attend the program," Dean Kunkel said.

Court Decides C.O.'s May Serve

WASHINGTON (AP) — Draft boards can require conscientious objectors to perform civilian service in lieu of military service, the Supreme Court has ruled.

In a 7-1 decision, the high court rejected the appeal of Vincent J. O'Connor, who was convicted in U.S. District Court for northern California of willful failure to report for civilian service as an alternative to military service.

O'Connor, who was sentenced to three years in prison, argued that Selective Service law has no moral or legal basis to require him to serve in the armed forces and therefore did not require him to do substitute civilian work.

Work Begins on Sidewalks

Parts of campus sidewalks that turn into lakes every time it rains are scheduled to get a face-lifting, according to Robert Rucker, the university's landscape architect.

Rucker said that his crews are making efforts to first locate sidewalk raintraps and then correct the situations, either by jacking up the cement slabs or making some arrangements for temporary drainage.

He said that most of the permanent repairs are scheduled to occur in the summer, when the earth is dry.

"We are currently plotting these areas on maps," Rucker

said. "Our big problem in the past has been in obtaining funds to this project, but it looks like we will have the money to make these repairs this summer."

Rucker added that at the same time he is planning to build new sidewalks where pedestrian paths cut through the grass indicate there should be some.

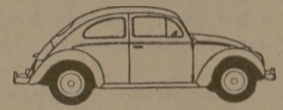
