All applications must be returned by March 25. Applicants should sign up for an interview with the nominating committee when they return the application, Denny said.



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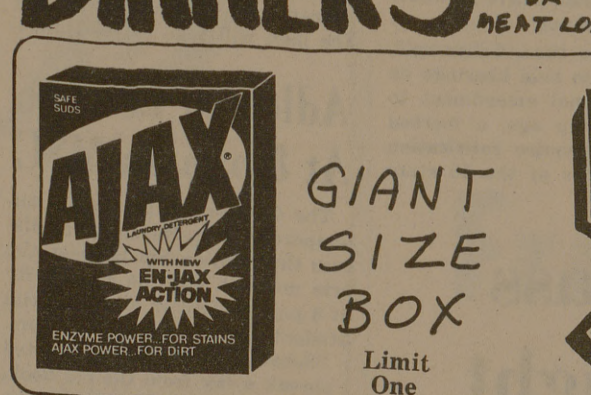
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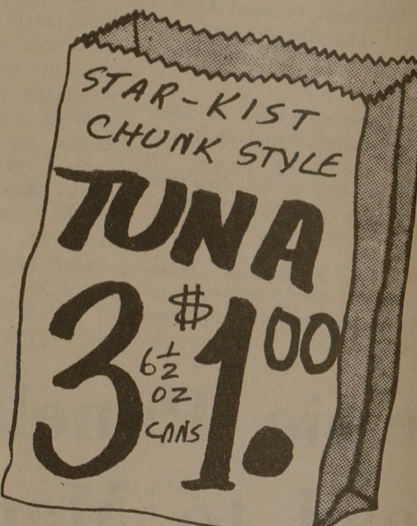
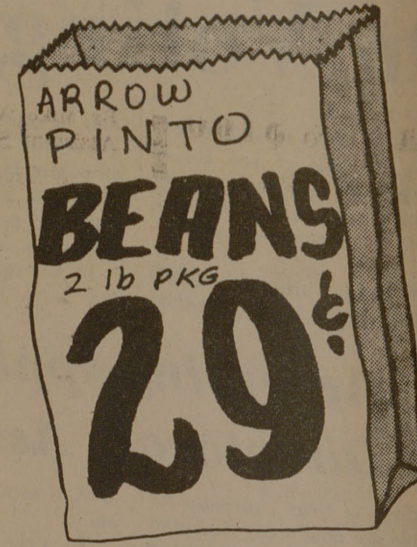
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
