





Blood Drive To Begin Wednesday

This year's Aggie Blood Drive will be from 8-5 p.m. Wednesday and Thursday in the basement of the Memorial Student Center.

The drive, dedicated to the memory of the late President Earl Rudder, is sponsored by Alpha Phi Omega, a national service fraternity, and is administered by the Student Senate Welfare Committee.

The blood collected will be used for research in heart and blood diseases by the Wadley Foundation of Molecular Medicine in Dallas.

Any person who donates blood will be able to receive blood for himself and his immediate family free during the following year. Each donor will receive a walletsized card acknowledging his donation and listing his blood type. The card will allow a donor to receive any quantity needed by contacting the welfare committee.

People wishing to donate blood should wear short sleeve shirts or blouses, recommended William Cronrath, APO public relations chairman. Civilian students under 21 years of age will need a note from their parents or guardians giving permission to donate blood, he said.

Students who have not previously registered may give blood at a time convenient to them, Cronrath said. "Anyone who has signed up but can't be there at that time can donate at any other time he is free," he added.




