Dr. Galvin, associate professor of veterinary parasitology, will study heartworms of dogs. The three-year project, entitled "Immunoprophylaxis for Control of Dirofilaria Immitis," has a proposed cost of \$154,228.

Dirofilaria immitis, commonly called heartworm, is caused by a nematode (worm) in the heart which can reach 10 to 12 inches in length.
