All students who are candidates for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy or Doctor of Education are required to order hoods as well as the Doctor's caps and gowns. The hoods are to be left at the University Exchange Store for delivery by a representative of the Exchange Store to the Registrar's Office no later than 1:00 p.m. Tuesday, May 19. The Ph.D. or D.Ed. hoods will not be worn in the procession since all such candidates will be hooded on the stage as part of the ceremony. Candidates for the Master's Degree will wear the cap and gown; all civilian students who are candidates for the Bachelor's Degree will wear the cap and gown; ROTC students who are candidates for the Bachelor's Degree will wear the appropriate uniform. All military personnel who are candidates for the Bachelor's or Master's degree will wear the cap and gown. Ph.D. candidates will arrange for rental of cap, gown, and hood at the Exchange Store between 8:00 a.m. Monday, April 27, and 5:00 p.m. Friday, May 1. Only Doctor's caps, gowns, and hoods will be available on a rental basis. The Master's and Bachelor's caps and gowns may be purchased at the Exchange Store after May 4, 1970. Rental fees and sale prices are as follows:
Doctor's Cap and Gown (rental).....\$7.56
Doctor's Hood (rental)..... 7.56
Master's Cap and Gown (sale)..... 7.04
Bachelor's Cap and Gown (sale)..... 6.34
All prices include sales tax. Payment is required at the time of placing the order.

To be eligible to purchase the Texas A&M University ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one academic year in residence and credit for ninety-five (95) semester hours. The hours passed at the preliminary grade report period on April 6, 1970, may be used in satisfying this ninety-five hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation may now leave their names with the ring clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building. She, in turn, will check all records to determine ring eligibility.
Orders for these rings will be taken by the ring clerk starting April 20, 1970, and continuing through May 25, 1970. The rings will be returned to the Registrar's Office to be delivered on or about July 10, 1970.
The ring clerk is on duty from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, Monday through Friday, of each week.
