The championship series is slated to begin with a doubleheader Thursday at Clark Field in Austin. The Aggies own a 12-2 mark good for the runnerup spot to the 12-0 Longhorns. A three game sweep or two game sweep and a rain out would

The Longhorns are deeper than just two aces, however, with senior Larry Hardy and sophomore Mike Beard each registering six wins this season.

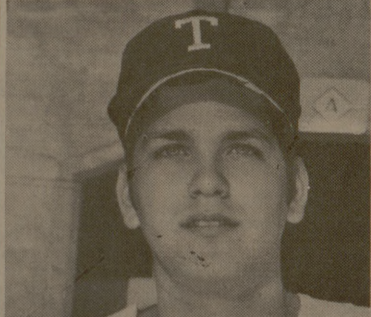
A&M counters with a staff that has been an important factor in

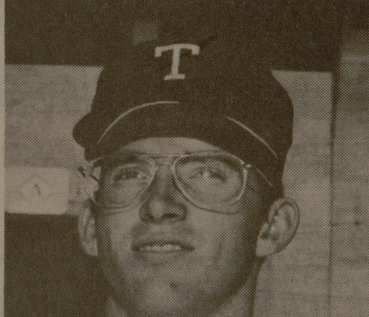

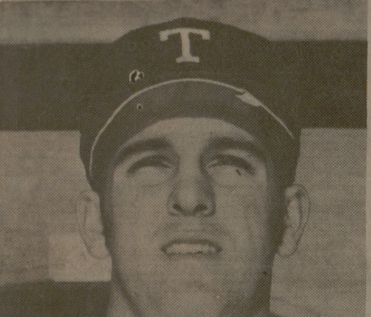
This will be Channel 2 on the cable in College Station and Bryan.

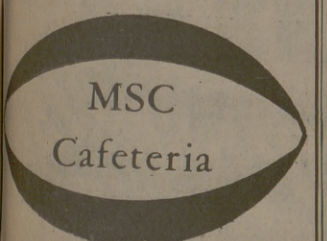
