Montreal won out on the second ballot in a vote by International Olmpic Committee members. It's the first time Canada has had an Olympics.

The result came as a shock, especially to the Russians whose official news agency, Tass, put out a premature bulleting some two hours before the final decision that Moscow had been awarded the Games

Montreal, a sprawling city of 21/2 million people of whom some 60 per cent are of French descent, is renowned as a sports capital in North America, home of the Expos major league baseball and the Candiens in the National Hockey League. Neither is a Summer Olympics sports.
