those which will be required at Easterwood Airport."  
The items included in the 10-year Easterwood improvement program are: overlay and strengthen taxiways; extend Runway 34 and Taxiway 34 approximately 1,000 feet; construct holding apron and high-speed turnoff for Runway 16; update airport lighting, including high-intensity runway lights; extend parking apron approximately 10,000 square yards, and provide a fire and rescue building.

Texas A&M, which has owned and operated Easterwood as a public air facility for the past 29 years, initially requested community help in 1964 and repeated its request two years ago.

At a press conference following the commissioning exercises, General Westmoreland commented on the logistical effects of the attacks on Viet Cong sanctuaries in Cambodia.

He said the VC will not be able

## Biology prof gets \$68,000 grant

Biology professor Dr. Herman Kleerekoper has been notified of approval of a \$68,142 Federal Water Quality Administration grant for the second year of a three-year study on heavy metal pollution and fish locomotion.

A quick method for detecting water pollution and its toxicity on fish is being developed by the Canadian zoologist. He noted the research is concerned with heavy metal pollutants, produced in mining, and the lethal concentrations on fish.
