

College Station to host ocean study

Colleges and universities from throughout the state have been invited to participate in Sept. 14-15 hearings of the Texas House of Representatives' Interim Study Committee on Oceanography at College Station.

Rep. Ray Lemmon of Houston, committee chairman, said the session is designed to give approximately 25 institutions of higher learning an opportunity to explain the scope of their oceanographic and marine-related programs.

Invitations were extended on the basis of known programs at various colleges and universities, primarily public institutions, the Houston lawmaker explained. He noted, however, that all institutions—public or private—are welcome to attend. All sessions will be open to the public, he added.

Representative Lemmon said the committee is particularly interested in the number of stu-

dents enrolled in oceanographic and marine-related degree programs at the various schools, as well as research activities and expenditures for such programs. Spokesmen for the institutions also will be asked to discuss their oceanographic and related programs for the next five years.

Other members of the committee are Rep. Menton Murray Harlingen, vice chairman; Reps. Lauro Cruz of Houston, Forrest A. Harding of Los Angeles.

Watson to begin lecture series

Harold L. Watson completed Atomic Energy Commission training at Oak Ridge, Tenn., and is making final preparations at Texas A&M to begin a series of lectures in more than 140 Texas high schools during 1970-71.

Watson, teacher-demonstrator for this year's "This Atomic World" program, ascends the stage next week in North Texas for the first program.

He begins the fall semester tour Sept. 8 at Dalhart and will make the 72nd presentation Dec. 23 in Decatur. The spring tour resumes on Jan. 11.

The demonstration lecture-type program is designed to show how nuclear energy benefits mankind. Conducted cooperatively by the AEC, Oak Ridge Associated Universities and Texas A&M, the program tour also furnishes a means of contact between the university and prospective students.

Watson will present a 40-minute program and make chalkboard talks to science classes in each school. In addition to the five-times-a-week presentations, the Arkansas A&M and Texas

A&M graduates will make one and service group talks.

"One of the big questions brought up by teacher-demonstrators at the seven weeks' training at Oak Ridge was the matter of radiation and thermal pollution allegedly caused by nuclear reactors," Watson said.

"I think I'm prepared to answer just about any question a student might ask," stated Watson, who will appear before an estimated 20,000 students this year.

The top member of the Oak Ridge teacher group, Watson is the first to have his presentation evaluated by AEC and OAU. Part of the training was conducting tours in the AEC's Museum of Atomic Energy, visited annually by a quarter of a million people.

Watson was an Academic Institute participant at Texas A&M last year, earning a Ph.D. degree in nuclear physics.

Texas A&M has participated in the "This Atomic World" program four years. Earlier program managers were Charles Lemore, Don Jensen and Bill Charles Mikloska.

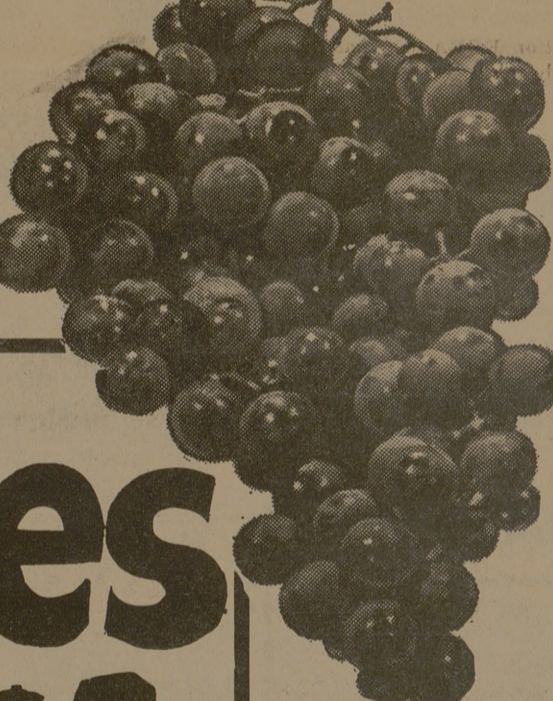
