## Ags open on AstroTurf

A collegiate soccer first will be recorded Saturday at Texas A&M when the Aggies open their 1970 season on the recently installed astroturf.

The game, which is against a strong Stephen F. Austin team, will have a 10 a.m. kickoff on the astroturf field to the south of Kyle Football stadium.

A&M with 14 returning lettermen from the 1969 season is a favorite against the young team from SFA.

In non-league play last year SFA tied the Aggies 3-3 in their first encounter but fell to A&M

in an injury-marred second game by a score of 5-3.

The Aggie booters finished third last year in the Texas Collegiate Soccer League with a 11-2-1 record. Recognized as one of the more colorful teams in the circuit, A&M will be fielding an offense of the same caliber as last year's unit which led the league in scoring. Additionally, the Aggies are blessed with an abundance of experienced halfbacks and fullbacks.

The Texas Collegiate Soccer League (TCSL) includes a mixture of private and public Texas colleges and universities representing various athletic affiliations: Southwest Conference, Southland Conference, Lone Star Conference and independent. Present members of the league include: University of Texas (Austin), University of Texas (Arlington), University of Houston, Texas A&M, TCU, Trinity, St. Mary's, Rice, Texas Tech, Stephen F. Austin, and Midwestern. With the

expected admission of SMU, Texas A&I, and LeTourneau the league will probably split into a north and south division for next year's season.

The UT Longhorns, undefeated in league play during the past two years are the defending champions. Top challengers are expected to be St. Mary's, Texas A&M, and Houston.

The league's opening schedule will find five games on Saturday and one on Sunday. Midwestern plays Trinity in San Antonio, Houston takes on Texas in Austin, UT/Arlington will play TCU in Ft. Worth, Rice will meet Texas Tech in Lubbock, and Stephen F. Austin will challenge the Aggies in College Station Saturday.

Midwestern, getting a workout in its first weekend of action, will play St. Mary's in San Antonio on Sunday.

There will be no admission charged for the A&M-SFA game, offering an excellent opportunity for sports fans to watch this fast and exciting game.

## Intramurals begin Monday

Intramural sports for the fall semester are slated to get underway Monday, according to Ray Fletcher, director of intramural sports.

## McLain now silent

DETROIT (AP)—Pitcher Denny McLain of Detroit, lately one of the biggest headline-getters in baseball, has become suddenly, totally silent.

"He's hiding out for a few days," said his wife, Sharyn, when reached at the couple's Lakeland, Fla., home.

McLain, the 26-year-old Cy Young Award winner, fell silent after Baseball Commissioner Bowie Kuhn suspended him for the third time in this season. Kuhn imposed the latest suspension for the remainder of the season with a terse public statement that seemed to raise more questions than it answered.

McLain reported to Kuhn's New York office with his lawyer to meet with the commissioner and Tiger officials. After the 2½-hour conference, Kuhn emerged and told reporters, "certain new allegations have been brought to my attention, including allegations regarding McLain's conduct with respect to the Detroit management and information that on occasions McLain has carried a gun."
